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Paddy/Rice

Despite the peak harvesting of paddy in the *Maha* season has been progressing in major producing areas in North Central Province the farm gate prices have remained at higher level in most of the major producing areas. The farm gate prices were continuously surged due to the limited arrival of paddy to the markets.

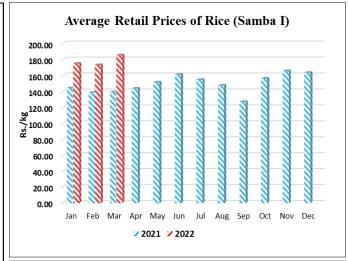
Prices of all local rice varieties, surged in most markets throughout the year 2022, reaching new record highs for raw rice in March, nearly 75 percent above their year-earlier levels.

Other Field Crops

The retail prices of imported dried chilli have increased by Rs.100.00/kg due to limited imports. Compared to the same period last year, retail prices of imported dried chilli have increased by 99%. The prices of *Vedalan* red onion have decreased by about Rs.56.00/kg due to the increased supply from the main producing areas. The prices of Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potatoes have decreased by 11% and 6% respectively. Prices of local potatoes are expected to be decreased further with the ongoing harvesting season for Welimada potato. The farm gate price of Green gram ranged between Rs 550.00- 700.00/kg in Anuradhapura, Moneragala and Embilipitiya areas during the middle of the month.

Vegetables

Vegetable production of 2021/2022 Maha season started to arrive to the market and it increases the supply of both up-country and low-country vegetables. Both wholesale and retail prices of all the vegetables except beans, radish,tomato and lime have decreased.





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EXPLANTATORY NOTE

The Food Information Bulletin is a monthly publication containing information relating to producer, wholesale and retail prices of selected food commodities in selected markets in and around Colombo and main markets in the major producing areas. Data on extent, production and imports are also available in the bulletin.

The information is analyzed and presented as, prevailing prices, price ranges, averages and comparison of monthly prices. The changes in prices reported are always in relation to price, which prevailed during the previous month unless otherwise stated.

1. Paddy/Rice

Crop Situation

The harvesting of paddy crop in 2021/22 *Maha* season is in progress and the peak harvesting was recorded in producing areas in North Central province. According to the field, information the issues related to chemical fertilizer become visible in all producing areas throughout the season and the paddy production outlook is not much satisfactory. However, most of the farmers used various kind of available organic fertilizers instead of chemical fertilizers. The latest assessment issued by the Department of Agriculture revealed that the targeted paddy, extent of 2021/22 *Maha* season is 855,309 ha and the cultivated extent is 806,644 ha. The expected production based on the reported sown extent up to end of February is 2.314 Million Mt, considering the crop damages and yield reduction due to the issues related to fertilizer supply. The major surplus of paddy expected from Eastern and North Central provinces. The harvesting will be expected until mid of April.

Producer Prices

Despite the peak harvesting of paddy in the *Maha* season has been progressing in major producing areas in North Central Province the farm gate prices have remained at higher level in most of the major producing areas. The farm gate prices were continuously surged due to the limited arrival of paddy to the markets. Farmers limitedly release their paddy stocks to the markets also caused the price increase The average prices of short grain paddy varieties have increased by Rs7.00-rs 17.00/kg with the highest increase from Polonnaruwa. The farm gate price of both long grain white and short grain paddy ranged as Rs.80.00-120.00/kg and Rs.80.00-118.00/kg respectively. The price of long grain red paddy ranged between Rs.90.00-122.00/kg in Mathara, Hambantota and Embilipitiya.

Compared to the same period of last year, prices of most of the paddy varieties have shown an increasing trend in all considered producing areas. Prices of long grain white have increased in the range of 83 % - 117% in all considered major producing areas with the highest in Polonnaruwa. Prices of short grain have increased in the range of 77% - 88% in all considered major producing areas with the highest also recorded in Polonnaruwa. Meanwhile the prices of long grain red have increased by 95% in Embillipitiya.

Rice Prices Demand/Supply Situation

Wholesale Prices

The prices of local and imported rice continuously surged throughout the month. The increased farm gate prices, increase transport cost and currency depreciation mainly caused to the price increase. The average prices of all the rice varieties have increased by Rs 17.00-Rs 21.00/kg with the highest increase for long grain red. The average price of samba and nadu rice ranged as Rs.150.00-200.00/kg and Rs.145.00-200.00/kg respectively. The price of *Keeri* samba ranged between Rs 200.00-260.00/kg. The prices of imported rice varieties also increased by Rs 19.00-Rs 23.00/kg. Prices of imported ponni samba, raw white and nadu ranged between Rs.120.00-180.00/kg and Rs.105.00-160.00/kg Rs.112.00-160.00/kg respectively.

Compared to the same period of the last year the current prices of local rice varieties have increased in the range of 41%-85% with the highest increase for raw red.

Retail Prices

In line with the wholesale market the monthly average retail prices of all local and imported rice varieties have increased throughout the month. The monthly average prices of local samba, nadu and raw rice have increased by 7%, 8%, and 9% respectively. The prices of imported samba, nadu and raw white have increased by nearly 12%. The prices of local samba, nadu, raw rice ranged Rs.160.00-220.00/kg, Rs.150.00-210.00/kg, and Rs 160.00-210.00/kg respectively. The highest price range of Rs.220.00- 260.00/kg was recorded for *Keeri* samba.

The prices of imported samba, raw white and nadu prices ranged Rs.130.00-190.00/kg, Rs.120.00-180.00/kg and Rs.120.00-180.00/kg respectively. Imported rice varieties available in all regional markets. Compared to the same period of the last year current prices of local samba, nadu, and raw rice varieties have increased by nearly 33%, 60% and 75% respectively.

2. Other Field Crops

2.1 Chilli

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The supply of green chilli from the main producing areas has increased during this month. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of green chilli have decreased significantly by about Rs.180.00/kg and Rs.164.00/kg. Average wholesale and retail prices of green chilli were Rs.306.00/kg and Rs.523.20/kg respectively. Higher producer prices for green chilli were recorded from the Embilipitiya area with the price range of Rs.378.00 - 522.00/kg during the month of March. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of green chillies have increased by about 71% and 44% respectively.

Wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli have increased by about Rs.106.00/kg and Rs.100.00/kg respectively due to limited imports. Average wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli were Rs.1013.85/kg and Rs.1197.17/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli have increased by about 102% and 99% respectively.

Crop Situation

The targeted extent of chilli in Maha 2021/22 season was about 11,383ha. About 7,530 ha had been cultivated by the end of March achieving 66% of the target of Sri Lanka. Both the highest targeted extent (1856 ha) and cultivated extent (1028 ha) were reported from the Anuradhapura district by the end of March 2022. Cultivation progress in the Puttalam district was at a low level and only 529 ha have been cultivated at the end of this month representing 30% of the target. The production forecast of chilli for the season is 37,151mt and out of that,48% of the production will be provided from Anuradhapura (15%), Jaffna (9%), Batticaloa (9%), Puttalam (8%) and Monaragala (7%).

2.2 Red Onion and Big Onion

Crop situation

The targeted extent of land of red onion for maha 2021/22 season was 3598 ha, of which 2194 ha has been cultivated by the end of February 2022. It represented 61% of the targeted extent of red onion in Sri Lanka. The targeted extent of land cultivation with red onion was about, 1900 ha in Jaffna and 1416 ha the target (75%) was grown at the end of March 2022. The cultivation progress of red onion was at a low level in Puttalam and other producing areas except for Jaffna. The production forecast of red onion for this season is 23,079mt and out of that 84% of the production will arrive to the market from Jaffna (78%) and Puttalam (6%) districts.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The market supply of big onions consisted of only imported big onions during this month. A quantity of 19,306 mt of big onion was imported in March 2022 and this quantity was lower than 8,460 mt compared to the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.85.89/kg and it has decreased by Rs.0.46/kg compared to the previous month. Both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onions have increased by about Rs.5.00/kg and Rs.2.00/kg respectively due to a decrease in the imported quantity. Average wholesale and retail prices of imported big onion were Rs.127.58/kg and Rs.175.30/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onions have increased by about 57% and 42% respectively.

The supply of local red onion has increased from the main producing areas during this month. Hence wholesale and retail prices of vedalan red onion have decreased by about Rs.116.00/kg and Rs.56.00/kg respectively. However, with the availability of good-quality stocks in the market, the wholesale price of sinnan red onion has increased by about Rs.4.00/kg while the retail price has decreased by Rs.56.00/kg. A quantity of 2.377mt of red onion was imported from India during this month and it was an increase of 736 mt compared to that of last month. The average CIF price was Rs.113.53/kg and it has decreased by Rs. 39.46/kg compared to the previous month. With the availability of ample stocks in the market, both wholesale and retail prices of imported red onions have decreased by about Rs.132.00/kg and Rs.102.00/kg. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of sinnan, vedalan and imported red onions have increased by about 22%, 41% and 42% respectively.

2.3 Potato

Crop Situation

The targeted extent of potato for *maha* 2021/22 season is 2,659 ha and about 2,156 ha had been cultivated by the end of the season achieving 81% of the target. In March about 120 ha of potato was cultivated in the country. However, compared to last *maha* season, the cultivated extent by the end of this *maha* season has decreased by 21%. According to the cultivated extent up to end of the season, the expected production of potato is 38,930 mt for this *maha* season (Table 2.3.1).

In the Nuwara Eliya district, the targeted extent is 1,139 ha and about 1,047 ha of potato had been cultivated by the end of the season (92% progress). Compared to last *maha* season, the cultivated extent is at high level during this *maha* season in the district. During the month only 83 ha of potatoes were cultivated in Nuwara Eliya district (Table 2.3.1).

The targeted extent for this *maha* season is 1,361 ha in the Badulla district and 1,019 ha had been cultivated by the end of the season achieving the targeted extent by 75%. The cultivated extent during this season has decreased by 38% compared to last *maha* season in the district. In March, only 37 ha of potatoes were cultivated in Badulla district. According to field information, more harvesting was taken place in Keppetipola, Bogahakumbura, Boralanda, Ambagasdova, Uvaparanagama areas of the Welimada DS division during this *maha* season and the supply will be expected till May for Welimada potato.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

A quantity of 13,132 mt of potato had been imported in March, which was 6,512 mt lower than that was imported during the previous month. Special commodity levy on imported potatoes have been reduced by Rs.30.00/kg with effect from 31/12/2021. Average CIF price was Rs.70.00/kg in March (Table 2.3.2). With regard to local potato, sufficient stocks of Nuwara Eliya and Welimada potatoes were available in the Colombo Wholesale market. In March, the wholesale prices of Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potatoes have decreased by 12% and 24% respectively. Further, the retail prices of Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potatoes have decreased by 11% and 6% respectively. Meanwhile, the wholesale price of imported potato has increased by 16% while the retail price has decreased by 6%. During the month of March, the wholesale prices of Welimada, Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes ranged between Rs.140.00-165.00/kg, Rs.160.00-190.00/kg and Rs.95.00-160.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of Welimada (55%), Nuwara Eliya (56%) and imported (27%) potatoes have increased (Table 2.3.3). Prices of local potatoes are expected to be decreased further with the ongoing harvesting season for Welimada potato.

2.4 Green gram and Cowpea Prices and Supply/ Demand Situation

The farm gate price of Green gram ranged between Rs 550.00- 700.00/kg in Anuradhapura, Moneragala and Embilipitiya areas during the middle of the month. The wholesale and retail prices of green gram ranged Rs 600.00-950.00/kg and Rs 600.00-1200/kg respectively. Meanwhile the retail prices of both White and Red Cowpea ranged between Rs 600.00-850.00/kg and 550.00-750.00/kg respectively. When compared to the previous month, prices of green gram and red cowpea have increased by 23% and 7% respectively. The price of white Cowpea has not changed significantly.

Crop Situation

2.5 Red dhal

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The wholesale price of red dhal ranged between Rs.295/kg and Rs.440/kg with an average of Rs.358.93/kg, and the retail price ranged between Rs.320/kg and Rs.460/kg with an average of Rs.380.69/kg. Compared with the last year wholesale and the retail prices have increased by 117% and 110% respectively.

3. Vegetables

Crop Situation

The total targeted extent including both up-country and low-country vegetables was 49,303ha and 41,695ha (85%) of the target had been achieved by the end of March 2022. The target for up-country vegetables was 18,795ha and 87% of the target had been achieved. Carrot and Leeks reported more than 100% progress from their cultivation targets. Bean (3,810ha), tomato (2,942ha), capsicum (1,979ha), and cabbage (1,947ha) were the most cultivated up-country vegetables. Among up-country vegetables, the highest production is expected from cabbage (50,175mt) followed by carrot (39,741mt). Regarding the low-country vegetable cultivation, 83% of the target (25,283ha) had been achieved by the end of March-2022. The most cultivated low-country vegetables were brinjals (4,869ha), long beans (4,432ha), pumpkin (3,830ha), and okra (3,516ha). Among low country vegetables, the highest production is expected from brinjals (60,052mt) and pumpkin (53,710mt).

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Supplies of most of the vegetable varieties were increased in most of the markets. The prices of most of the vegetable varieties have declined during the month too. Among up-country vegetables, all the wholesale prices have decreased by 27% - 49% except beans, radish and tomato. Wholesale prices of beans, radish and tomato have increased by about 7%, 58%, and 16% respectively due to limited supply from main producing areas. wholesale prices of all the low-country vegetables have decreased between 4%-42%. However, the price of lime has increased by about 32%. In line with the wholesale prices, retail prices of most of the up-country and low-country vegetables have decreased. The highest retail price decrease was observed for capsicum (Rs.279.33/kg) followed by carrot (Rs.164.58/kg) with high supply from the main producing areas. As in the wholesale market, retail market prices of beans, radish, tomato and lime have increased by Rs.11.72/kg, Rs.13.17/kg, Rs.24.64/kg and Rs.60.98/kg respectively due to limited supply. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of all the vegetables except cabbage have increased in the range of 3%-61%.

4. Fruits

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

In March, the wholesale prices of most of the fruit varieties have decreased. Considering the prices of banana varieties, the prices of *ambul* (16%), *seeni* (7%) and *anamalu* (1%) banana have decreased, while the prices of *koikuttu* (5%) has increased. During the month, the wholesale prices ranged between Rs.150.00-190.00/kg (*kolikuttu*), Rs.40.00-70.00/kg (*ambul*), Rs.50.00-80.00/kg (*seeni*), Rs.14.00-17.00/fruit (*ambun*) and Rs.11.00-14.00/fruit (*anamlu*). Considering the mango varieties, the prices of all the varieties have decreased with the highest price decrease of 57% for *kohu*, followed by *betti* (50%), karthakolomban (7%) and vilad (7%) mangoes.

Prices of all the sizes of pineapple have increased further in the range of 21%-31% due to lean harvesting season for pineapple in Gampaha district. Monthly average wholesale prices were Rs.438.00/fruit (large), Rs.346.00/fruit (medium) and Rs.260.00/fruit (small) sizes of fruits respectively.

Considering other types of fruit varieties, the prices of orange (27%), papaw (26%), wood apple (19%) and avocado (10%) have decreased. Compared to the same period of last year, the current wholesale prices of most of the fruit varieties have decreased with the highest price decrease of 37% reported for wood apple (Table 4.1).

According to the price behaviour of the wholesale market, the retail prices of most of the fruit varieties have decreased in March. Accordingly, the prices of all the banana varieties have decreased in the range of 1%-2%. During the month, the prices ranged between Rs.200.00-260.00/kg for *kolikuttu*, Rs.80.00-140.00/kg for *seeni* and *ambul* banana in Colombo and suburb markets. Among the mango varieties, the price of *karthakolomban* has decreased by 22%.

Considering the price behaviour for pineapple varieties, the prices of all the sizes have increased by 12% due to increased wholesale prices and the prices ranged between Rs.240.00-600.00/fruit in Colombo suburbs markets.

Considering the other types of fruits, the retail prices of orange (15%), avocado (14%), papaw (10%) and wood apple (7%) have decreased in line with the decreased wholesale prices for those type of fruits. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of most of the fruit varieties have increased with the highest price increase of 119% reported for pineapple (medium size) (Table 4.2).

Exports/Imports of Fruits

According to the Sri Lanka Customs, Sri Lanka had exported 1,338 mt of fresh fruits in March, 2022 to the value of Rs.146 mn. Of the exported quantity, 95% were papaw, and 4% were fresh pineapple and the rest was fresh mango, guava, mangosteen, avocados and oranges. In the month of February, 2022, the quantity exported was 1,073 mt. Therefore, compared to last month, the exported quantity had increased in March (Table 4.3).

With reference to imports, Sri Lanka had imported 2,860 mt of fresh fruits in March and the value was Rs.941 mn. Of the imported quantity, 55% were apple, 28% were grapes and 17% were oranges. In the month of February 2022, the quantity imported was 1,748 mt. Therefore, compared to last month, the imported quantity had increased in March (Table 4.4).

5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Though the fishing season in the Southern and north - western coastal belt is in progress, prices of all the fish varieties had increased, some with a considerably high margin, at the wholesale market, in March 2022 compared to February 2022, due to the fuel price hike a result of heavy depreciation of SLR against USD.

Fishes had been supplied to the market mainly from Negombo, Kalpitiya, Chillaw, Matara and Galle. Of all the fresh fish varieties, prices of both salaya and mora had upsurged by the highest margin, by 33% during the month. Next, prices of hurulla, thora, balaya, thalpath and paraw had increased in the range of 13% - 16%. Supplies of deep-sea fish varieties such as thalapath and paraw had dropped considerably due to the fuel shortages. Further, kelawalla ad shrimp (small) prices had increased by less than 10%. Compared to the same period of the last year, wholesale prices of all the fresh fish varieties had increased considerably, in the range of 26%-87% due to the fuel price hike. The highest price increase was noted for thalapath.

In line with the wholesale fish price movement, prices of all the fresh fish varieties had increased in the range of 5%-20% at the retail level. Salaya prices had upsurged by the highest margin, by 20% during the month. Further, prices of hurulla and balaya had increased by 14% and 10% respectively, at the retail level. Prices of rest of the dried fish varieties had increased by more than 5%. Compared to the same period of the last year, retail prices of all the fresh fish varieties had increased considerably, in the range of 17%-67%, with the highest price increase noted for balaya.

Dried Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Prices of all the dried fish varieties had increased with the highest price increase reported for salaya. Prices of salaya had increased by 24%, followed by sprats (imported) as 21% and sprats (local), mora (imported) and kattawa (imported) as 12% at the wholesale level, compared to last month. Further, prices of rest of the dried fish varieties had increased in the range of 2% -7%. Price increases are mainly due to the rising cost of production and cost of transportation due to the fuel price hike. The main supply areas of the local varieties were Valachchenai, Mannar and Kalpitiya. Compared to the same period of the last year, wholesale prices of all the varieties had increased, with the highest price increase reported for salaya as 129%.

Compared to previous month, the retail prices of all the dried fish varieties had increased with the highest price increase noted for both sprats (imported) and salaya as 20%. Prices of rest of the varieties had increased by less than 10%. Compared the same period of last year, the current retail prices of all the varieties had increased significantly, with the highest price increase reported for thora as 67%.

Eggs

Prices of both brown and white eggs had increased significantly by 41% and 44% respectively, at the wholesale level compared to February 2022. Raising cost of imported day - old chicks and feeds due to the depreciation of SLR is the reason for the significant price hike. The monthly average wholesale price of brown and white eggs was in the range of 27.00 - 31.50/egg and 25.00 - 29.50. In line with the wholesale price behavior, prices of both brown and white eggs had increased by 40% and 43% respectively at the retail level. The monthly average retail prices of a brown and a white egg was in the range of Rs.27.00 - 34.00/egg and Rs.26.00 - 32.00/egg respectively. Compared the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of eggs had increased by 76% and 82% respectively.

Meat

Prices of all meat varieties had further increased at the retail market, compared to last month, due to price rise in inputs. The highest price increase was noted for beef (without bones) as 10%. Prices of both chicken (broiler) and chicken (curry) had upsurged by 7% at the retail level. Prices of pork had increased by 5%. Compared to the same period of the last year, prices of all the meat varieties had increased with the highest was reported for as beef (without bones) 50%.

6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

Wheat grain and Wheat flour

A total quantity of 65,667mt worth of 5,609mn wheat grain had been imported from India during the month of March. The average CIF price was Rs.85.00/kg. Compared to the last month average CIF price for wheat grain has increased by Rs.12.00/kg.

A total quantity of 11,342mt of wheat flour worth of 1141mn had been imported mainly from India, Bangladesh and Pakistan during the month of March. Compared to the last month, average CIF price for wheat flour has increased by Rs.16.00/kg.

Meanwhile, the local retail price of wheat flour ranged between Rs.155.25-157.65/kg and the average price was Rs.171.12/kg. Compared to the last month, the average retail price of wheat flour has increased by Rs.14.34/kg during the month. Further, compared to the same period of last year, retail price of wheat flour has increased by 85%.

Compared to the last month, average CIF price for sugar has increased by Rs.24.00/kg.

Referring to the local retail price of sugar for the month of March, the average retail price was Rs.171.98/kg. Compared to the last month the average retail price of sugar has increased by Rs 23.00/kg.
