# FOOD INFORMATION BULLETIN

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#### Highlights

#### Paddy/Rice

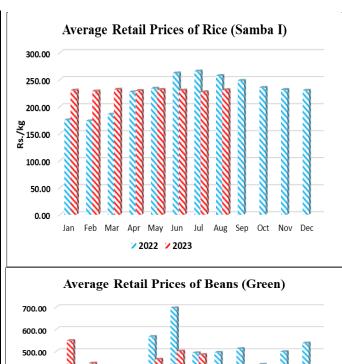
Producer prices of short grain, long grain white and long grain red paddy varieties have shown an increasing trend in all major producing areas except Polonnaruwa during the month. Wholesale prices of all the local rice varieties increased compared to the previous month due to limited supplies. Retail prices of samba grade 1, keeri samba and Nadu grade 1 had exceeded the MRP.

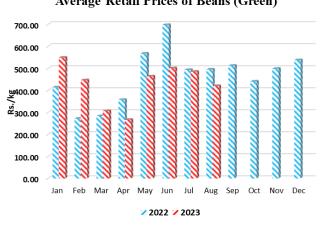
#### Vegetables

Due to increased supply, prices for most vegetable varieties have decreased significantly. Retail prices of vegetables have dropped by 28% to 437%, with the highest price decrease reported for capsicum at 437%. The highest retail price observed was Rs. 448.00/kg for carrots, while cucumbers were priced at the lowest average of Rs. 166.00/kg. However, prices for green chilies and lime have risen by 10% and 71%, respectively. Vegetable prices are expected to continue declining in the coming months.

#### Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

The prices of most fish varieties have decreased in the wholesale market, attributed to high supply resulting from favorable weather conditions during the lean season along the southern and western coastal belt. Additionally, there has been a noticeable and ongoing shift in consumer preferences away from more expensive protein sources, such as fish and meat, towards more affordable options like eggs. Following the importation of eggs and the lifting of the maximum retail price previously imposed, retail prices for eggs have dropped by less than 21%.





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#### EXPLANTATORY NOTE

The Food Information Bulletin is a monthly publication containing information relating to producer, wholesale and retail prices of selected food commodities in selected markets in and around Colombo and main markets in the major producing areas. Data on extent, production and imports are also available in the bulletin.

The information is analyzed and presented as, prevailing prices, price ranges, averages and comparison of monthly prices. The changes in prices reported are always in relation to price, which prevailed during the previous month unless otherwise stated.

#### 1. Paddy/Rice

#### **Crop Situation**

According to the Crop Forecast from the Department of Agriculture, the target area for paddy cultivation in the 2023 Yala season is 542,099 ha. As of the end of August 2023, the sown extent is reported at 495,281 ha, achieving 91% of the target. The forecasted paddy production, based on the reported sown extent as of the end of August 2023, is 1.83 million metric tons, accounting for crop losses.

#### **Producer Prices**

Producer prices of short grain, long grain white and long grain red paddy varieties have shown an increasing trend in all major producing areas except Polonnaruwa during the month. Harvesting of paddy in 2023 *Yala* season was almost completed in the producing areas in the Eastern province. Prices of short grain and long grain white were ranged between Rs.93.00-116.00/Kg and Rs.80.00-110.00/Kg respectively. The lowest price for long grain white was recorded in Ampara due to

receiving high moisture paddy from the new harvest. The price range of Rs 120.00-145.00/Kg was recorded for the *Keeri* samba paddy in major producing areas.

Compared to last month, the average prices of short grain paddy have increased by less than 4% in all the producing areas except Polonnaruwa. Meanwhile, the prices of short grain and long grain white and Keeri samba have decreased by 10%, 5% and 13% respectively in Polonnaruwa area due to ongoing harvesting. Compared to the same period of last year, the prices of short grain, long grain white and long grain red have decreased in the range of 02-19%, 08-29% and 27-28% respectively.

#### **Rice Prices Demand/Supply Situation**

#### **Wholesale Prices**

Wholesale prices of all the local rice varieties increased compared to the previous month due to limited supplies. The highest price increase of 8% was recorded for raw red and raw white rice and prices ranged between Rs.140.00-170.00 and 160.00-200.00/kg respectively. Prices of keeri samba had exceed the government regulated maximum retail price even at the wholesale market and price ranged between Rs. 255.00-280.00/kg. Wholesale prices of samba grade I and II ranged between

Rs. 205.00-2220.00 and 195.00-210.00/kg during the month. Furthermore, wholesale prices of all the imported rice varieties had increased in the range of 1-10% due to increased import prices.

Compared to the same period of the last year, wholesale prices of all varieties except keeri samba had decreased by 08-30% with the highest price decrease of 30% being recorded for raw red rice.

#### **Retail Prices**

Retail prices of all local rice varieties had increased in the range of 1-4% compared to the previous month due to increased wholesale prices. Retail prices of samba grade 1, keeri samba and Nadu grade 1 had exceeded the MRP. A shortage of keeri samba was observed at retail level. Compared to the same month of last year, retail prices of all local rice varieties except keeri samba had decreased in the range of 10 -32%, and the highest price increase was recorded for raw red.

#### 2. Other Field Crops

#### 2.1 Chilli

#### **Crop Situation and Progress**

The targeted extent for green chilli cultivation in the Yala season of 2023 was 9,773 ha. By the end of August 2023, 4,762 ha had been cultivated, representing 49% of the target. The crops are at different growth stages across the main producing areas. In the Puttalam district, approximately 407 ha have been cultivated, which is 30% of the targeted extent. Based on the cultivated area by the end of this month, the expected production of green chilli for this Yala season is 27,276 Mt, with 43% of the supply coming from Puttalam (14%), Anuradhapura (8%), Mahaweli areas (9%), Interprovincial DDA areas (4%), and Vavuniya (8%).

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The supply of green chilli from main producing areas has increased this month, resulting in significant decreases in both wholesale and retail prices—by approximately Rs. 134.00/kg and Rs. 194.00/kg, respectively. Wholesale prices for green chilli ranged from Rs. 300.00 to Rs. 700.00/kg, while retail prices ranged from Rs. 400.00 to Rs. 1,000.00/kg. The highest producer prices were recorded in the Embilipitiya area, with prices ranging from Rs. 520.00 to Rs. 694.00/kg during August. Compared to the same period last year, wholesale and retail prices for green chilli have increased by 15% and 2%, respectively.

In August 2023, Sri Lanka imported 3,057 mt of dried chilli, which is 1,527 mt less than the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs. 778.40/kg, a decrease of Rs. 23.84/kg compared to the previous month. Consequently, wholesale and retail prices for imported dried chillies fell by approximately Rs. 57.00/kg and Rs. 12.00/kg, respectively. Prices ranged from Rs. 1,000.00 to Rs. 1,100.00/kg at the wholesale level and Rs. 1,100.00 to Rs. 1,500.00/kg at the retail level. Compared to the same period last year, both wholesale and retail prices for imported dried chilli have decreased by about 30%.

#### 2.2 Red Onion and Big Onion

#### **Crop situation and Progress**

The targeted extent for big onion cultivation in the 2023 Yala season was approximately 6,466 ha; however, only about 440 ha had been cultivated by the end of August 2023, representing just 7% of the target. In the Matale district, the targeted extent was 1,597 ha, with only 105 ha cultivated by the end of August, also accounting for only 7% of the target. Compared to the previous Yala season, both the cultivated extent and production have decreased by approximately 81% and 73%, respectively. Contributing factors to this decline include adverse weather conditions in recent seasons, high production costs, and market price uncertainties. In Matale, the cultivated extent of big onions has fallen by about 91% compared to the previous Yala season, with many farmers shifting their focus to mango, papaw, and vegetable cultivation instead.

The targeted extent for red onion cultivation in the 2023 Yala season was 3,911 ha, with approximately 2,505 ha cultivated by the end of August 2023, representing 64% of the target. The Jaffna district recorded both the highest targeted extent (2,000 ha) and the highest cultivated extent (1,817 ha), achieving 91% of its target. The estimated production for this Yala season is 26,275 Mt, with 84% of this supply coming from Jaffna (64%) and Puttalam (20%) districts.

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The market supply of big onions consisted entirely of imports this month. A total of 26,951 mt of big onions were imported in August 2023, which is 3,864 mt less than the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs. 75.91/kg, an increase of Rs. 8.25/kg compared to the previous month. Consequently, both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onions rose by Rs. 33.00/kg and Rs. 37.00/kg, respectively. The wholesale price ranged from Rs. 110.00 to Rs. 190.00/kg, while retail prices ranged from Rs. 120.00 to Rs. 260.00/kg. Compared to the same period last year, wholesale and retail prices of imported big onions have decreased by approximately 1% and 3%, respectively. In contrast, the supply of Vedalan red onions from main producing areas has increased this month, resulting in significant decreases in both wholesale and retail prices of about Rs. 156.00/kg and Rs. 171.00/kg, respectively. Prices for Vedalan red onions ranged from Rs. 240.00 to Rs. 320.00/kg at the wholesale level and from Rs. 300.00 to Rs. 600.00/kg at the retail level. There were no imported red onion stocks available in the market. Compared to the same period last year, wholesale and retail prices of Vedalan red onions have decreased by approximately 19% and 14%, respectively.

#### 2.3 Potato

#### **Crop Situation and Progress**

The targeted extent for potato cultivation in the Yala 2023 season is 3,040 ha, with approximately 1,668 ha cultivated by the end of August, achieving 55% of the target. This is similar to last year, where 56% of the target was met by the end of August 2022. The cultivated extent for this Yala season represents 92% of the total cultivated area compared to the same period in Yala 2022. Based on the cultivated area as of the end of August, the expected potato production for this Yala season is 30,511 mt. However, the current cultivation extent is lower than the three-year monthly average.

In the Nuwara Eliya district, the targeted extent is 1,016 ha, with about 534 ha cultivated by the end of August, achieving 52% of the target. In the Badulla district, the targeted extent is 2,022 ha, with a cultivation progress of 56% (Crop Forecast, Yala 2023, Volume 05, Socio-Economic & Planning Centre/DOA).

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

Both local and imported stocks of potatoes were available in the market in August. The average producer prices were Rs. 296.00/kg for Nuwara Eliya potatoes and Rs. 256.00/kg for Welimada potatoes. During this month, the wholesale prices for Nuwara Eliya potatoes remained stable, while retail prices saw a 4% increase compared to the previous month. The wholesale prices of imported potatoes also did not show significant changes from the previous month. The wholesale prices for Nuwara Eliya, Welimada, and imported potatoes ranged between Rs. 280.00-350.00/kg, Rs. 260.00-280.00/kg, and Rs. 160.00-250.00/kg, respectively. Compared to the same period last year, the retail prices for Nuwara Eliya potatoes decreased by 13%.

#### 2.4 Green gram and Cowpea

#### **Crop Situation and Progress**

Local green gram cultivation achieved 87% of the target extent in August, while cowpea (55%) and black gram (27%) showed relatively low progress in cultivation. As of the end of August, the cultivated areas for Yala 2023 were recorded at 182% of the total cultivated area in Yala 2021 for green gram and 91% for cowpea. Specifically, 9,211 ha of green gram and 6,310 ha of cowpea were cultivated by the end of August 2022. The major producing districts for green gram include Kurunegala, Hambantota, Moneragala, and Mannar, while Ampara and Moneragala are key for cowpea. Overall, green gram cultivation has remained above normal throughout most of the 2023 Yala season, except for April and May. In contrast, black gram has shown below-normal cultivation throughout the Yala 2023 period, and cowpea has experienced below-normal cultivation for most months, except in August (Crop Forecast, Yala 2023, Volume 05, Socio-economic & Planning Centre/DOA).

#### Prices and Supply/ Demand Situation

The wholesale prices of green gram ranged from Rs. 900.00 to 960.00/kg, while retail prices were between Rs. 1,000.00 and 1,400.00/kg. Compared to the same period last year, both wholesale and retail prices for green gram increased by less than 20% (16% for wholesale and 20% for retail). For cowpea, the wholesale prices for white and red varieties ranged from Rs. 850.00 to 950.00/kg, with retail prices between Rs. 900.00 and 1,300.00/kg. Compared to the same period last year, the retail price of white cowpea increased by 27%, while red cowpea prices rose by 46%.

#### 2.5 Red dhal

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The wholesale and retail prices of red dhal increased by nearly 5% compared to July, with wholesale prices ranging from Rs. 265.00 to 300.00/kg. Retail prices followed a similar trend, showing a decrease of 6% from July. Compared to August 2021, wholesale and retail prices of red dhal decreased by 35% and 23%, respectively.

#### 3. Vegetables

#### **Crop Situation**

Harvesting for Yala 2023 has commenced, with cultivation progress recorded at 76% (13,941 ha) for up-country vegetables and 92% (20,964 ha) for low-country vegetables. The targeted extents and expected productions for this season are 18,388 ha and 217,718 mt for up-country vegetables, and 22,689 ha and 250,732 mt for low-country vegetables. Crops such as ash plantain, pumpkin, brinjal, kekiri, winged bean, tomato, and knol-khol have reported over 90% progress towards their respective targets. The highest cultivation shares were noted for beans (25%) among up-country vegetables and brinjals (20%) among low-country vegetables (Crop Forecast, Vol. 05, Yala 2023, Socio-Economics & Planning Center/Department of Agriculture).

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The Yala harvesting season has commenced, leading to increased supply from production areas and a decrease in prices for most vegetable varieties. Wholesale prices of up-country vegetables have dropped by 5% to 49%, with the highest decrease reported for beetroot at 49%. Carrots recorded the highest price at Rs. 332.00/kg, while radishes had the lowest price at Rs. 49.00/kg.

For low-country vegetables, wholesale prices have decreased by 16% to 60%, except for cucumbers and ash plantains. Capsicum had the highest price at Rs. 231.00/kg, while cucumbers were priced at Rs. 72.00/kg. The most significant decrease of 60% was observed for tomatoes. Conversely, the price of lime increased by 130%, with an average price of Rs. 644.00/kg due to limited supply from producing areas.

Compared to the same period last year, wholesale prices for various vegetables have decreased by 19% to 63%. However, prices for carrots and ash plantains have risen by 38% and 34%, respectively, with the largest price drop of 63% recorded for capsicum. Additionally, lime prices have surged by 309% compared to last year's prices.

In line with the decrease in wholesale prices, retail prices for all vegetable varieties have also fallen, with reductions ranging from 10% to 45%. The most significant price drop was observed for tomatoes at 45%. Carrots recorded the highest retail price at Rs. 448.00/kg, while cucumbers had the lowest price at Rs. 166.00/kg. Additionally, prices for green chillies and lime increased by 10% and 71%, respectively. Compared to the same period last year, retail prices for most vegetables have decreased by 11% to 50%, with the exceptions of carrots and beetroot, which have not seen a decline.

#### 4. Fruits

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

In August, prices for all types of fruits, except for wood apple, orange, and imported grapes, increased due to decreased supply from major producing areas. Specifically, prices for banana varieties rose significantly: ambul bananas increased by 43%, anamalu by 28%, seeni by 22%, kolikuttu by 21%, and ambun by 20%. The wholesale prices for these bananas ranged as follows: kolikuttu at Rs. 380.00-600.00/kg, ambul at Rs. 120.00-270.00/kg, seeni at Rs. 120.00-160.00/kg, ambun at Rs. 30.00-36.00/fruit, and anamalu at Rs. 24.00-32.00/fruit.

For pineapples, prices across all sizes increased by 12% to 20%, with average wholesale prices at Rs. 968.00/fruit for large, Rs. 791.00/fruit for medium, and Rs. 614.00/fruit for small sizes. Regarding mangoes, all varieties saw price increases, with the karthakolomban variety experiencing the highest rise of 220%, followed by vilad mangoes at 76%, attributed to the tail end of the harvesting season.

Other fruit varieties also recorded notable price increases, with papaw rising by 92%, slime apple by 53%, and passion fruit by 42%, primarily due to low stock levels. Conversely, the prices of wood apple (down 53%) and orange (down 27%) decreased due to increased supply from the ongoing harvesting period.

Compared to the same period last year, current wholesale prices for most fruit varieties have risen, with the highest increase reported for medium pineapples at 85%, followed by anamalu and ambun bananas.

In August, retail prices for all types of fruits, except for wood apple, orange, and imported grapes, increased according to wholesale market trends. Among banana varieties, ambul bananas experienced the highest price increase of 27%, while other varieties rose by 12% to 17%. During the month, prices ranged from Rs. 400.00 to 800.00/kg for kolikuttu bananas, Rs. 180.00 to 350.00/kg for ambul bananas, and Rs. 150.00 to 280.00/kg for seeni bananas in Colombo and suburban markets.

Pineapple prices also rose across all sizes by 18% to 20%, with medium-sized fruits priced between Rs. 780.00 and 1,100.00/fruit in Colombo suburbs. Among mango varieties, prices for karthakolomban and vilad increased by 138% and 42%, respectively, due to low stock levels. Additionally, retail prices for other fruits followed suit: passion fruit increased by 33%, papaw by 30%, and slime apple by 17%, reflecting the rise in wholesale prices for these varieties. Conversely, wood apple prices decreased by 38%, and orange prices fell by 11%.

Compared to the same period last year, current retail prices for all fruit varieties have risen, with the most significant increase of 111% reported for large-sized pineapples.

#### **Exports/Imports of Fruits**

According to Sri Lanka Customs, the country exported 1,857 mt of fresh fruits in August 2023, valued at Rs. 231 million. Notably, 98% of the exported quantity consisted of papaw. This represents an increase compared to August 2022, when 1,584 mt were exported (Table 4.4).

On the import side, Sri Lanka brought in 472 mt of fresh fruits during the month, with a total value of Rs. 243 million. Grapes were the most imported fruit, accounting for 240 mt, followed by apples at 145 mt. This year, the imported quantity has also increased compared to the same period last year (Table 4.5).

#### 5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

#### **Fish**

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

In August, wholesale prices for all fish varieties, except for small shrimp, experienced a decline. The most significant price drop was recorded for hurulla at 22%, followed by balaya at 20%, and both kelawalla and paraw at 8%. Other fish varieties saw price reductions of less than 5%, again excluding small shrimp.

Compared to the same period last year, wholesale prices for most fresh fish varieties also decreased, ranging from 6% to 37%, with the most notable decline in salaya prices at 37%.

Reflecting the wholesale market trends, retail prices for all fish varieties, except for small shrimp, also fell. The largest price decrease was observed for mora at 29%, followed by balaya at 23% and hurulla at 20%. Other varieties saw reductions of less than 10%, again with the exception of small shrimp. Compared to the same period last year, retail prices for most fresh fish varieties decreased, with the most significant drop for small shrimp at 30%.

#### **Dried Fish**

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

In August 2023, prices for most dried fish varieties also saw a decline. The largest price drops at the wholesale level were recorded for salaya at 29% and balaya at 24%. The prices of other dried fish varieties, except for maduwa and local sprats, decreased by less than 6%.

In contrast, the prices of local sprats and maduwa experienced a slight increase of less than 3%. Compared to the same period last year, wholesale prices for all dried fish varieties dropped, with the most significant decrease noted for imported sprats at 39%.

Consistent with the wholesale market trends, retail prices for all dried fish varieties also fell. The largest retail price drop was recorded for maduwa at 36%, followed by salaya at 13% and anguluwa at 5%. Prices for all other dried fish varieties decreased by less than 5%. When compared to the same period last year, retail prices for all dried fish varieties dropped, with the most substantial decline observed for imported sprats at 37%.

#### **Eggs**

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The Consumer Affairs Authority has issued a special gazette notification lifting the maximum retail price (MRP) on eggs, which was previously set at Rs. 44 for white eggs and Rs. 46 for brown eggs. This order took effect on July 25th. Imported eggs are available at 'Sathosa' markets for Rs. 35.00 each, leading to a significant drop in average egg prices in August.

The recorded average wholesale price for a white egg was Rs. 43.96, and for a brown egg, it was Rs. 44.63—both lower than last month's prices of Rs. 53.00 and Rs. 53.53, respectively. In both wholesale and retail markets, the prices for brown and white eggs have decreased significantly. At the wholesale level, prices dropped by 17% for brown eggs and 20% for white eggs. In the retail market, prices fell by 14% for brown eggs and 20% for white eggs. When compared to the same period last year, retail prices for both types of eggs have decreased by 18%.

#### Meat

In August, prices for most meat varieties slightly decreased in the retail market compared to July. The largest drop was observed in chicken (curry), with a reduction of 7%. Chicken (broiler) prices decreased by 6%, while pork saw a modest decline of 1%. In comparison to last year, prices for most meat varieties have increased, with pork experiencing the highest rise at 26%

#### 6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

#### Wheat grain and Wheat flour

In August, Sri Lanka imported a total of 2,909 mt of wheat grain valued at Rs. 448 million. This quantity represents a decrease of approximately 19,626 mt compared to the previous month. The majority of wheat grain was sourced from Canada (86%) and Australia (14%), with CIF prices of Rs. 153.22/kg and Rs. 158.40/kg, respectively. The average CIF price increased by Rs. 41.00/kg compared to the previous month, with the highest CIF price attributed to wheat imported from Australia and the lowest to wheat from Canada.

The total quantity of wheat flour imported in August was 10,835 mt, worth Rs. 1,380 million, which is a decrease of around 23,327 mt from the previous month. Most of the wheat flour was imported from Turkey (93%), with a CIF price of Rs. 124.02/kg, while the remainder came from the UAE (7%) and small amounts from India. The average CIF price for imported wheat flour this month was Rs. 127.40/kg, showing no significant change from the previous month.

Meanwhile, the local retail price of wheat flour ranged from Rs. 210.32 to Rs. 216.15/kg, with an average price of Rs. 211.74/kg. This represents a 4% decrease from the previous month and a 30% decrease compared to the same period last year.

#### Sugar

In August, Sri Lanka imported a total of 20,757 mt of sugar, valued at Rs. 4,942 million, marking an increase of approximately 7,854 mt compared to the quantity imported in July. The largest portion of sugar, accounting for 77% of the total, was sourced from India. The remainder was imported from Thailand (8%), the UAE (1%), Brazil (4%), Malaysia (7%), Switzerland (1%), and South Korea (2%). The average CIF price for sugar was Rs. 238.10/kg, which represents an increase of Rs. 4.43/kg from the previous month. The highest CIF price was paid for sugar imported from the UAE (Rs. 245.68/kg), while the lowest was for sugar imported from Brazil (Rs. 230.69/kg).

Regarding local retail prices for sugar, they ranged from Rs. 253.50 to Rs. 259.50/kg, with an average retail price of Rs. 256.11/kg. This reflects a 7% increase compared to last month, although it represents a 19% decrease compared to the same period last year.
