# FOOD INFORMATION BULLETIN

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#### Highlights

#### Paddy/ Rice


The producer prices for short grain and Keeri Samba paddy varieties are exhibiting an upward trend, whereas prices for long grain white and red varieties have experienced a decline in almost all producing areas. Supplies of local rice varieties such as *Samba*, *Nadu*, raw red, and raw white increased during the month due to *Maha* harvesting. Wholesale prices of *Samba* grade I and II ranged between Rs. 205.00-215.00 and 195.00-210.00/kg respectively during the month and the price decreased by 3% compared to the previous month. Aligned with the trends in wholesale prices, retail prices for most local rice varieties experienced a decline, with the most notable decrease of 5% observed in raw red rice.

#### Vegetables

Supplies of vegetables were limited as the harvesting of the *Maha* season has reached its end phase and prices of most of the vegetable varieties have increased due to seasonal demand for Sinhala and Hindu New Year festival. The wholesale prices of up-country vegetables have increased by 1%-84% except bean and knolkhol. The highest price increase was reported for cabbage (84%). In line with the fluctuations of wholesale prices, retail prices of most of the vegetable varieties have slightly increased. Retail prices of up-country vegetables had increased by 1%-39%. Highest price increase was reported for cabbage (39%).

#### Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Due to lower food inflation and abundant supply resulting from favorable weather conditions, the prices of most fish varieties have experienced a further decline in both wholesale and retail markets. However, the retail prices of both types of eggs have increased due to a shortage that occurred after the implementation of maximum retail prices (MRP) for brown eggs at Rs. 46.00 and white eggs at Rs. 44.00.





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#### **EXPLANTATORY NOTE**

The Food Information Bulletin is a monthly publication containing information relating to producer, wholesale and retail prices of selected food commodities in selected markets in and around Colombo and main markets in the major producing areas. Data on extent, production and imports are also available in the bulletin.

The information is analyzed and presented as, prevailing prices, price ranges, averages and comparison of monthly prices. The changes in prices reported are always in relation to price, which prevailed during the previous month unless otherwise stated.

#### 1. Paddy/Rice

#### **Crop Situation**

The targeted paddy area for the Yala 2023 season is established at 533,639 hectares. As of the conclusion of April 2023, the reported sown extent stands at 213,092 hectares, marking a 40% achievement towards the set target. Noteworthy is the substantial 53% year-on-year increase in the sown area of paddy for April 2023. Of particular significance is the cultivation progress observed in several districts within the Northern and Eastern provinces of the country, including Kilinochchi, Mullaitivu, Batticaloa, Ampara, and Vavuniya. In these regions, cultivation has surpassed 80% of the targeted paddy area.

#### **Producer Prices**

The producer prices for short grain and Keeri Samba paddy varieties are exhibiting an upward trend, whereas prices for long grain white and red varieties have experienced a decline in almost all producing areas. Specifically, the producer prices of short grain paddy have seen an increase across all major producing areas except Ampara, ranging between Rs. 90.00-111.00/kg. Notably, the lowest average price was observed in the Kalawewa area. For long grain white paddy, the lowest average price was reported in Dehiattakandiya, while Plonnaruwa and Nikaweratiya recorded the highest average prices. Conversely, the producer prices of long grain red paddy have decreased in all major producing areas, ranging between Rs. 75.00-85.00/kg. This contrasts with Keeri Samba paddy, where prices ranged between Rs. 110.00-136.00/kg, with the lowest average price noted in Ampara.

Comparing prices to the same period last year, there has been a reduction in producer prices for all paddy varieties, ranging from 1% to 28%. Notably, there has been a significant decrease in prices for long grain red paddy.

#### **Rice Prices Demand/Supply Situation**

#### Wholesale Prices

Supplies of local rice varieties such as *Samba*, *Nadu*, raw red, and raw white increased during the month due to *Maha* harvesting. Wholesale prices of *Samba* grade I and II ranged between Rs. 205.00-215.00 and 195.00-210.00/kg respectively during the month and the price decreased by 3% compared to the previous month. Furthermore, wholesale prices of *Nadu* grade I and II ranged between Rs. 180.00-190.00 and Rs. 175.00-185.00/kg and price has decreased by 2%. The highest price decrease among all the rice varieties was recorded for raw red and the price ranged between rs.150.00-165.00/kg. In contrast, the wholesale price of *Keeri samba* has increased by Rs. 3.00/kg due to decreased supplies.

Compared to the same period last year, wholesale prices of samba and Keeri samba prices have increased while all the other local rice varieties decreased. The highest price decrease of 21% was recorded for raw red followed by raw white (15%).

#### **Retail Prices**

Aligned with the trends in wholesale prices, retail prices for most local rice varieties experienced a decline, with the most notable decrease of 5% observed in raw red rice. Retail prices of *Samba* grade I and II ranged between Rs. 220.00-235.00 and210.00-230.00/kg respectively during the month and the price decreased slightly by 1% compared to the previous month.

Furthermore, retail prices of *Nadu* grade I and II ranged between Rs. 210.00-220.00 and Rs. 200.00-210.00/kg and Prices remained relatively stable compared to the previous month.

In a year-over-year comparison, retail prices for most rice varieties increased. The dynamics of retail pricing are influenced by various factors, and it's noteworthy that despite the recent month's decreases, the general trend over the past year has been an upward trajectory in retail prices for local rice varieties. These fluctuations in retail prices are indicative of the complex interplay between factors such as wholesale prices, market demand, and supply conditions.

#### 2. Other Field Crops

#### 2.1 Chilli

#### **Crop Situation and Progress**

The targeted extent of land for green chilli cultivation in Yala 2023 was 9,563 ha. The extent of lands cultivated with green chilli was 1,250 ha by the end of April and it was 13% of the target. The highest targeted extent (1370ha) was recorded from the Puttalam district and the highest cultivated extent was recorded from Anuradhapura district (133ha) at the end of this month.

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

Supply of green chilli from main producing areas has decreased during the month as at the end of the Maha season. However, wholesale price of green chilli has decreased by about Rs.10.00/kg due to availability low quality stocks in most of the markets. Meanwhile retail price of green chilli has increased by Rs.28.00/kg due higher demand. Average wholesale and retail prices of green chilli were Rs.300.27/kg and Rs.518.45/kg respectively. Higher producer prices for green chilli were recorded from the Embilipitiya area with the price range of Rs.358.00 – 466.00/kg during the month of April. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of green chillies have decreased by about 23% and 13% respectively.

A quantity of 2,183 mt of dried chillie was imported in April, 2023 and this quantity was less than 1225mt compared to the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.835.97/kg and it has increased by Rs.112.42/kg compared to the previous month. Wholesale price of imported dried chillies has increased by about Rs.6.00/kg while retail price has decreased by Rs.87.00/kg. Prices ranged between Rs.1000.00-1160.00/kg at the wholesale level and Rs.1100.00 – Rs. 1600.00/kg at the retail level. Compared to the same period last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli have decreased by about 21% and 16% respectively.

## 2.2 Red Onion and Big Onion

#### **Crop situation and Progress**

The targeted extent of land for big onion for yala season 2023, was 7,133ha and no cultivation was recorded in major producing areas. Nursery preparation of big onion has started in Matale district and Yala cultivation will commence next month. The targeted extent of land for red onion for yala season was 3896 ha, of which 259 ha has been cultivated by the end of the month. It represented 7% of the targeted extent of red onion in Sri Lanka. The targeted extent of land cultivation with red onion was about, 2000 ha in Jaffna and 168 ha of the target (8%) was grown at the end of April 2023.

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The market supply of big onion consisted of only imported and big onions during this month too. A quantity of 23,253mt of big onion was imported in April 2023 and this quantity was lower than the 6,919 mt compared to the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.60.57/kg and it has decreased by Rs.1.18/kg compared to the previous month. Both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onions have decreased by about Rs.3.00/kg and Rs.5.00/kg respectively. The average wholesale and retail prices of imported big onion were Rs.91.35/kg and Rs.120.91/kg respectively and both prices have decreased by about 50% and 49% respectively when compared to the same period of last year.

The supply of local red onion has increased slightly from the main producing areas during this month. Hence both wholesale and retail prices of sinnan have decreased by about Rs.1.00/kg and Rs.6.00/kg respectively. However, both wholesale and retail prices of vedalan have increased by Rs.56.00/kg and Rs.5.00/kg respectively due availability of good quality stocks in most of the markets. Retail prices range between Rs.320.00 -360.00/kg for sinnan and Rs.460.00- 520.00/kg for vedalan. A quantity of 1,522mt of red onion was imported from India during this month and it was an increase of 181 mt compared to that of last month. The average CIF price was Rs.107.85/kg and it has decreased by Rs. 1.48/kg compared to the previous month. Both wholesale and retail prices of imported red onions have increased by about Rs.35.00/kg and Rs.34.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of sinnan, vedalan and imported red onions have increased by about 18%, 5% and 18% respectively.

#### 2.3 Potato

#### **Crop Situation and Progress**

Yala cultivation of potatoes commenced in only Badulla district in April while in Nuwara Eliya district the Yala harvesting season started and around 5% of the total cultivated area was harvested at the end of the month. According to field information, more than 95% of the harvesting had been completed in Welimada potatoes in Badulla and the supply of Welimada potato will end in the month of May. In Badulla district, only 29 ha has cultivated in April while it is 39 ha in Nuwara Eliya district. The targeted extent of potato for *yala* 2023 season is 2,685 ha which is higher (48%) than the previous year actual cultivated area (1,814ha).

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

A quantity of 9,545 mt of potato had been imported in April, which was 10,934 mt lower than that was imported during the previous month. Average CIF price was Rs. 59.00/kg in April. The 12% reduction in the imports compared to the previous month and the reduced supply from the local production areas (Welimada) resulted in a price increase in the wholesale as well as the retail market.

With regard to local potato, stocks of both Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potatoes were available in the Colombo wholesale market with ongoing harvesting for maha season. However, the demand was high during the festival season in the country during the month. Hence, the wholesale prices of both Nuwara Eliya and Welimada potatoes have increased by 20% and 13% in April. The retail price of Nuwara Eliya potato has increased slightly by 7%. Meanwhile, the wholesale and retail prices of imported potato have increased by 23% and 12% respectively. On average, the producer prices of Nuwara Eliya and welimada potato was Rs.223.00/kg and Rs. 210/kg respectively in April. During the month, the wholesale prices of Welimada, Nuwara Eliya, and imported potatoes ranged between Rs. 190.00-250.00/kg, Rs. 220.00-270.00/kg and Rs. 125.00-160.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period last year, the current retail prices of Welimada(19%), Nuwara Eliya (16%) potatoes increases while imported potato prices decrease by 10%.

The reduced supply from the producing area due to the end of the harvesting season in Welimada area, and reduced *maha* season cultivation extent due to high seed prices and other input prices in Nuwara Eliya district will reduce the local supply of potatoes to the markets. By considering those, a price increase is expected in the coming months.

#### 2.4 Green gram and Cowpea

#### **Crop Situation and Progress**

The targeted cultivated extent Green gram and Cowpea is 11,080 ha and 10,828 ha respectively). Cowpea and black gram reported 28% and 14% progress from the targets at the beginning of the Yala 2023 season. It was recorded that the Hambanthota, Moneragala, Kurunegala, Ampara, Anuradhapura and Putthalam districts are the major producing areas for the Green gram cultivation while Ampara, Anuradapura, Kurunegala and Moneragala Vavuniya are for Cowpea.

#### Prices and Supply/ Demand Situation

The wholesale price of green gram ranged between Rs. 1340.00 and Rs. 1480.00/kg with an average of Rs.1399.00 1399.30/kg in April. The average price has reduced by 2% compared to the previous month. However, compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale price has increased by 66%. In the meantime, retail price of green gram ranged between Rs. 1400.00/kg and 1600.00/kg

with an average of Rs. 1569.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, the retail price has not drastically changed and has increased by 1%. However, compared to the same period of last year, the retail price of this month has increased by 37%.

Average wholesale prices of white and red cowpea were recorded as Rs. 646.00/kg and Rs.696.00/kg, respectively in April. The price of white cowpea ranged between Rs.220.00/kg and Rs.240.00/kg, and that of red cowpea ranged between Rs. 550.00/kg and Rs.800.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, price of white cowpea has decreased by 20% while, the price of red cowpea has decreased by 16%. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of white and red cowpea have increased by 8% and 34%, respectively. Meanwhile, average retail prices of white and red cowpea were recorded as Rs. 1569.00/kg and Rs. 1043.00/kg, respectively. Retail price of both white and red cowpea ranged between Rs. 900.00/kg and 1200.00/kg. Compared to the previous month, price of white cowpea has decreased by 13% and price of red cowpea has decreased by 10%. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of white and red cowpea have decreased by 36% and 49%, respectively.

#### 2.5 Red dhal

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

Wholesale price of red dhal ranged between Rs. 310.00 and Rs. 335.00/kg with an average of Rs. 323.00/kg, and the retail price ranged between Rs. 330.00 and Rs. 360.00/kg with an average of Rs. 353.00/kg. Moreover, both prices have not changed significantly during this month. Compared to the same period last year, wholesale and retail prices have decreased by 29%.

During this month, a total of 17,563 MT of red dhal has been imported. Of the total red dhal imports, around 95 % has been imported from Australia, and the rest (5%) from Canada, India and Singapore. The total value of the red dhal imports was Rs. 3,938 million.

#### 3. Vegetables

#### **Crop Situation**

Cultivation season of Yala 2023 is commenced and cultivation progress of up-country and low-country vegetables are recorded as 14% (2,061ha) and 19% (3,8994ha) respectively. The targeted extent and production of up-country vegetables in this season are 14,442ha and 31,305mt respectively. For the low-country vegetables, 20,973ha of cultivation extent and 43,823mt production are expected. *Carrot, leeks, and kekiri reported above 20% progress from their targets.* (*Crop Forecast, Vol.01, Yala 2023, Socio-Economics & Planning Center/Department of Agriculture*).

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

Supplies of vegetables were limited as the harvesting of the *Maha* season has reached its end phase and prices of most of the vegetable varieties have increased due to seasonal demand for Sinhala and Hindu New Year festival.

The wholesale prices of up-country vegetables have increased by 1%-84% except bean and knolkhol. The highest price increase was reported for cabbage (84%). The highest price of Rs.153.00/kg was recorded for tomato while the lowest price of Rs.77.00/kg was observed for radish. However, bean and Knol khol prices are decreased from 26% and 14% respectively. With regard to the low-country vegetables, the wholesale prices have slightly decreased by 6%-35% except brinjal, capsicum and snake gourd. The highest price of Rs. 404.00/kg was recorded for capsicum, while the lowest price of Rs. 46.00/kg was for pumpkin. However, the price of brinjal increased by 54%. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale prices of most of the vegetable varieties have increased with 6%-70%the highest price increase of 219% being reported for ash plantain. However, bean, carrot and pumpkin prices are decreased and ranged 11%-42%.

In line with the fluctuations of wholesale prices, retail prices of most of the vegetable varieties have slightly increased. Retail prices of up-country vegetables had increased by 1%-39%. Highest price increase was reported for cabbage (39%) and the highest price decrease was reported for beans as 91%. The highest price of Rs.639.00/kg was reported for capsicum while the lowest

price of Rs.127.00/kg was observed for pumpkin. In addition, price of green chilli has increased by 6% and price of lime has increased by 56%.

#### 4. Fruits

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

In April, the wholesale prices of most of the fruit varieties have increased. Considering the prices of banana varieties, the prices of *ambul* (29%), *kolikuttu* (23%), *anamalu* (13%), *ambun* (10%), and *seeni* (10%) banana have increased. During the month, the wholesale prices ranged between Rs.380.00-580.00/kg (*kolikuttu*), Rs.160.00-260.00/kg (*ambul*), Rs.140.00-180.00/kg (*seeni*), Rs.30.00-43.00/fruit (*ambun*) and Rs.28.00-37.00/fruit (*anamalu*). Prices of all the sizes of pineapple have decreased in the range of 19%-25% due to sufficient stocks received from Gampaha district. Monthly average wholesale prices were Rs.565.00/fruit (large), Rs.464.00/fruit (medium) and Rs.364.00/fruit (small) sizes of fruits respectively. Considering the mango varieties, the price of *karthakolomban* mango has decreased further by 17% due to arrival of ample stocks from major producing areas and the prices are expected to be decreased further due to on-going harvesting season till June.

Considering the other types of fruit varieties, the highest price decrease was recorded for passion fruit (21%). Further, the prices of papaw and avocado have decreased by 20% and 8% respectively due to arrival of ample stocks. However, the prices of wood apple (42%), grapes (24%) and orange (16%) have increased due to availability of limited stocks.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current wholesale prices of all the fruit varieties have increased with the highest price increase of 151% reported for *ambul* banana (Table 4.1).

According to the price behaviour of the wholesale market, the retail prices of most of the fruit varieties have increased in April. Considering the price behaviour for banana varieties, the highest price increase of 23% was reported for *kolikuttu* banana, followed by *ambul* banana (21%). Prices of *ambun, anamalu* and *seeni* banana have increased in the range of 10%-14%. During the month, the prices ranged between Rs.450.00-700.00/kg for *kolikuttu*, Rs.200.00-380.00/kg for *ambul* banana and Rs.200.00-320.00/kg for *seeni* banana in Colombo and suburb markets. Considering the price behaviour for pineapple varieties, the prices of all the sizes have decreased in the range of 9%-15% due to decreased wholesale prices and the prices ranged between Rs.320.00-720.00/fruit in Colombo suburbs markets. Among the mango varieties, the price of *karthakolomban* has decreased by 28% due to availability of ample stocks in the market.

Considering the other types of fruits, the retail prices of passion fruit (20%), papaw (12%) and avocado (10%) have decreased due to increased supply. However, the prices of wood apple (35%) and slime apple (10%) have increased due to increased wholesale prices. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of all the fruit varieties have increased with the highest price increase of 115% reported for *ambul* banana (Table 4.2).

#### **Exports/Imports of Fruits**

According to Sri Lanka Customs, Sri Lanka had exported 807 mt of fresh fruits in April, 2023 to the value of Rs.156 mn. Of the exported quantity, 93% were papaw and 4% were fresh pineapple. Compared to April 2022 (1,434 mt), the exported quantity had decreased during this year (Table 4.4).

With reference to imports, Sri Lanka had imported 700 mt of fresh fruits during the month and the value was Rs.283 mn. Apple was the mostly imported fruit type with the quantity of 449 mt, followed by grapes (117 mt). Compared to the month of April, 2022 (1,172 mt), the imported quantity had significantly decreased during this year (Table 4.5).

#### 5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

#### **Fish**

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

Though the food inflation (Y-o-Y) had decreased further to 30.6% in April 2023 from 47.6% in March 2023, prices of most of the fish varieties, except for thora had increased at the wholesale level due to high demand during the Sinhala – Tamil new year season. Further, there was a falling supply from southern and western coastal belts as it enters the lean season for fishing. As mentioned earlier, due to the rise in the cost of living and loss of income, consumers have been compelled to reduce their consumption of high-value foods such as fish and meat, decreasing demand for these products. A shift in demand from high-value fish varieties to low-value ones continue to observe.

Among all the fresh fish varieties, the largest price hike was observed for balaya at 20%, followed by thalapath at 12%, and mora at 4%. Equally, prices for most of the remaining fish varieties, with the exception of thalapath had increased within the range of 1% to 3%.

As mentioned earlier, the economic crisis-induced demand shift from high-value fish varieties to low-value ones has been observed. For instance, the price of hurulla and salaya which had been increasing for several consecutive months, in the last year and this year, showed a further price increase in April due to high demand. In comparison to the same period in the previous year, wholesale prices for most fresh fish varieties had increased, ranging from 17% to 53%, with the most notable increase seen in the price of salaya as 53%.

As a result of the wholesale price changes, the retail prices for most of the fish varieties have increased in comparison to the previous month. The largest price increase was reported for balaya

as 8%. Next, prices of both salaya and thalapath had increased by 6%. Meantime, prices of hurulla and shrimp (small) had increased by 5 %. However, prices of kelawalla and thora had dropped by less than 4%. When compared to the same period of the previous year, retail prices for all fresh fish varieties have increased, with the most significant increase noted for shrimp (small) as 41%.

#### **Dried Fish**

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

In April 2023, prices of most dried fish varieties also experienced an increase in prices following the high prices of the common fresh fish varieties.

The highest price hike at the wholesale level was recorded for balaya at 10% due to high fresh fish prices. Further, prices of both sprats, anguluwa (imported) and maduwa had increased by less than 4%. The prices of remaining dried fish varieties, except for salaya, sprats (imported) and kattawa (imported) had increased in the range of by 2% - 3%. However, prices of salaya dried fish had shown a high price drop of 14% due to decreased fresh fish prices reported in March.

Compared to the same period of the last year, wholesale prices of most of the dried fish varieties had increased, with the highest price increase noted for maduwa at 24%.

During the same period, the retail prices of all the dried fish varieties had slightly decreased, which could be attributed to the high demand for fresh fish, meat and eggs during the festival

season. The highest price drop was reported for salaya as 6%. Prices of other dried fish varieties, a slight price drop of less than 4%. Compared to the same period of the last year, retail prices of most of the dried fish varieties had increased, with the highest price increase noted for mora as 20%.

#### **Eggs**

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The Consumer Affairs Authority had issued a new Gazette notification on January 20<sup>th</sup>, 2023, renewing the maximum retail price (MRP) for eggs. According to the stipulated MRP, white eggs must be sold at Rs. 44, while brown eggs must be sold at Rs. 46.

In the wholesale market, prices of brown eggs had remained the same, while white eggs had increased by 10% during the festival season. The recorded average wholesale price of a white egg (Rs. 48.00) was higher than the stipulated maximum retail price of Rs.44.00 in April.

After the implementation of new pricing regulations, a shortage of brown eggs occurred in the retail market. The few retail outlets that had brown eggs available experienced a 7% price drop in April. However, the reported average price of Rs 53.00 for brown egg was higher than the MRP of Rs.46.00. Meanwhile, the average retail price of white egg has increased by 2% at the retail

level. Consequently, the retail prices for both brown and white eggs saw a significant increases, rising by 94% and 101% respectively. When comparing to the same period last year, the wholesale prices of both types of eggs had surged by over 70%.

#### Meat

Compared to March, prices of most of the meat varieties had slightly increased at the retail market in April. The highest price hike was noted for chicken (broiler) as 20%. Next, except for beef (without bones), prices of all the remaining meat varieties had increased slightly, by 2%. Compared to last year, prices of all the meat varieties had increased with the highest was reported for pork as 82%.

#### 6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

#### Wheat grain and Wheat flour

A Total quantity of 77,656mt of wheat grain, worth of 10,273mn had been imported during April. Compared to the quantity imported in previous month, the quantity imported in this month has decreased by around 32,763mt. Wheat grain was mainly imported from Canada (99%) at a CIF price of Rs.132.06/kg and rest of quantity imported from Australia, Oman and India. Compared to the previous month, average CIF price has increased slightly by Rs.1.28/kg. The highest CIF price was for wheat grain imported from Oman whilst the lowest CIF price was for wheat grain imported from Canada.

Total Quantity of wheat flour imported in this month was 9,001mt, worth 1,432mn. Compared to the previous month, this month quantity has increased by around 3,092mt. The highest quantity of wheat flour has imported from Turkey at a CIF price of Rs.154.55/kg and that was 90% of the

total quantity of wheat flour imported in April. Remain quantity has imported from India (3%), UAE (5%), Ukraine (1%) and few quantities from Thailand and Italy. Average CIF price of wheat flour imported in this month was Rs.157.32/kg and compared to the previous month it has decreased by Rs.10.36/kg.

Meanwhile, the local retail price of wheat flour ranged from Rs.227.38-229.88/kg and the average price was Rs.228.32/kg. Compared to last month, the average retail price of wheat flour has increased by 1% and compared to the same period of last year, price has increased by 4%.

#### Sugar

Total quantity of sugar imported in this month was 10,507mt worth 2,086mn and it has decreased by around 10,905mt when compared to the quantity imported in March. The largest quantity of sugar was mainly imported from India and that was 84% of the total quantity. Rest of quantity has imported from Thailand (9%),Pakistan(4%), South Korea(2%) and UAE(1%). The average CIF price was Rs.198.48/kg and compared to the previous month it has slightly increased. The highest CIF price was paid for sugar imported from South Korea (Rs.237.02/kg) while the lowest was paid for sugar imported from Pakistan (Rs.178.34/kg).

Referring to the local retail price of sugar for the month, price ranged from Rs.221.89-241.54/kg and the average retail price was Rs.233.53/kg. Compared to the last month, average retail price has increased by 6% and compared to the same period of last year price has increased by 1%.
