#### Highlights

#### Paddy/Rice

- Improved market supply of newly harvested shortgrain and long-grain paddy varieties due to ongoing harvesting in major producing areas.
- Increased supply has led to a decrease in wholesale rice prices by 1% to 6% compared to the previous month.
- Retail prices for most rice varieties have decreased by 1% to 5%.
- Keeri samba rice remains scarce at retail level, priced between Rs. 360.00 and Rs. 390.00/kg, significantly above the regulated maximum retail price (MRP).


#### Vegetables

- Vegetable prices have decreased due to higher supply from main producing areas.
- Retail vegetable prices dropped by 5% to 43%.
- The highest price decrease was noted for brinjal at Rs. 308.00/kg.
- Capsicum had the highest average price at Rs. 1,086.00/kg, while cucumber had the lowest at Rs. 206.00/kg.


#### Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs, and Meat

- Prices of most fish varieties have declined at the wholesale market due to high supply during the peak season from the southern and western coastal areas, supported by favorable weather conditions.
- The Eastern coastal belt also saw increased supply during the lean season.
- Low availability of imported, low-priced eggs has led to an increase in egg prices in February.

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#### EXPLANTATORY NOTE

The Food Information Bulletin is a monthly publication containing information relating to producer, wholesale and retail prices of selected food commodities in selected markets in and around Colombo and main markets in the major producing areas. Data on extent, production and imports are also available in the bulletin.

The information is analyzed and presented as, prevailing prices, price ranges, averages and comparison of monthly prices. The changes in prices reported are always in relation to price, which prevailed during the previous month unless otherwise stated.

#### 1. Paddy/Rice

#### **Crop Situation**

According to the Crop Forecast (Volume 3, Maha 2023/24) by the Department of Agriculture, paddy area target for the Maha 2023/24 season is 869,990 ha. Cultivation target has almost been realized at major producing areas. Paddy production forecast based on the reported sown extent as at the end February 2024 is 2.64 million metric tons, accounting for crop losses. Maha 2023/24 production would be sufficient to feed the national rice requirement up to 8 months (August 2024). Paddy harvesting has almost been completed in Batticaloa, Trincomalee, Kilinochchi and Jaffna districts while over 75% been completed in Anuradhapura, Kurunegala and Hambantota at the end of February 2024.

#### **Producer Prices**

Market supply of newly harvested short grain and long grain paddy varieties improved due to ongoing harvesting in all the major producing areas. Hence, producer prices of all the paddy varieties have decreased across all most all the major producing areas compared to the previous month. As a result, producer prices of short grain paddy have decreased by 4-13% in all the producing areas except Dehiattakandiya. The highest producer price decrease for short grain paddy was recorded from Kalawewa followed by Anuradhapura.

Producer prices for long grain white paddy ranged between Rs.78.00 -114.00/kg in the major producing areas and the price has dropped by 6-13% in all the producing areas except Dehiattakandiya compared to the previous month. The largest price drop for long grain white was recorded in Kalawewa and Anuradhapura due to ongoing harvesting. Producer prices for long grain red ranged from Rs.92.00-100.00/kg in Hambantota, Matara, and Embilipitiya. Furthermore, producer price of keerisamba ranged between Rs.115.00-156.00/kg and price has dropped by 5% and 9-14% in all most all the major producing areas.

Compared to the same period last year, producer prices for short grain, long grain white, and keeri samba have increased across all most all price collection areas, with keeri samba recording the highest price increase of 16-35%.

#### **Rice Prices Demand/Supply Situation**

#### Wholesale Prices

Supplies of all the rice varieties had increased during the month due to ongoing harvesting in all the major paddy producing areas. Hence, the wholesale prices for all the rice varieties have decreased by 1-6% compared to the previous month. The highest decrease of 6% was recorded for Nadu 1 followed by Nadu 2 due to increased supply. The price for Keeri Samba ranged between Rs. 315.00-335.00/kg and price has dropped by 4. Wholesale prices for Samba Grade I and II ranged between Rs. 235.00-240.00 and Rs. 225.00-232.00/kg, respectively, with average prices decreasing by less

than 2%. Wholesale prices for raw white and raw red also have decreased by 5% and 4% respectively due to improved supplies.

Compared to the same period last year, wholesale prices for all rice varieties increased by 01-43%, with Keeri Samba showing the highest rise of Rs.93.00/kg.

#### **Retail Prices**

In line with wholesale prices, retail prices for most of the rice varieties decreased by 1-5% compared to the previous month. Keeri Samba was hardly available at retail level and price ranged between Rs.360.00-390.00 recording far higher the MRP. Furthermore, the average retail prices of Samba Grade 1, and grade 1, and Keeri Samba exceeded the government-regulated maximum retail price (MRP). Compared to the same month last year, retail prices for most rice varieties increased by 2-44%, with keeri samba showing the highest rise. In contrast, the retail price of raw red rice decreased by Rs. 8.00/kg compared to the same period last year.

#### 2. Other Field Crops

#### 2.1 Chilli

#### **Crop Situation and Progress**

The targeted extent for green chilli cultivation in the Maha 2023/24 season was 10,064 ha. By the end of February, 6,743 ha had been cultivated, reaching 67% of the target. Anuradhapura district recorded the largest cultivated area (621 ha) by the end of the month, with the highest projected yield of 3,012 mt. The total estimated green chilli production for this Maha season is 33,917 mt, with approximately 45% of this output expected from Anuradhapura (8%), Puttalam (8%), Jaffna (8%), Monaragala (6%), Batticaloa (7%), and Inter-Provincial DDA areas (8%).

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The supply of green chilli from major producing areas increased this month, resulting in significant price drops at both wholesale and retail levels, with reductions of approximately Rs.198.00/kg and Rs.309.00/kg, respectively. The average wholesale and retail prices of green chilli were Rs.724.25/kg and Rs.1,166.46/kg, respectively. Compared to the same period last year, wholesale and retail prices have risen by about 165% and 143%.

In February 2024, 3,486 mt of dried chilli was imported, 261 mt less than the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.679.07/kg, a decrease of Rs.49.50/kg compared to the previous month. Consequently, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chillies dropped by around Rs.104.00/kg and Rs.60.00/kg, respectively. Prices ranged from Rs.800.00–980.00/kg at the wholesale level and Rs.1,000.00–1,400.00/kg at retail. Compared to the same period last year, wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli have increased by about 25%.

#### 2.2 Big Onion and Red Onion

#### **Crop Situation and Progress**

The targeted land extent for red onion cultivation in the Maha 2023/24 season was 3,085 ha, of which 2,184 ha had been cultivated by the end of February 2024, achieving 71% of the target for Sri Lanka. In Jaffna, the targeted extent was 1,920 ha, and 1,821 ha (95%) was cultivated by the end of February. Meanwhile, in the Puttalam district, cultivation reached 35% of the targeted extent by the same period. The total estimated production of red onion for this Maha season is 26,052 mt, with approximately 93% of the output expected from Jaffna (84%) and Puttalam (9%).

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The market supply of big onions this month consisted solely of imports. A total of 10,601 mt of big onions was imported in February 2024, which was 10,310 mt less than the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.246.28/kg, reflecting an increase of Rs.54.09/kg from the previous month. However, wholesale and retail prices of imported big onions decreased by about Rs.18.00/kg and Rs.53.00/kg, respectively. The average wholesale and retail prices of imported big onions were Rs.338.26/kg and Rs.428.49/kg, showing increases of approximately 204% and 170%, respectively, compared to the same period last year.

The supply of local red onions increased slightly from major producing areas this month, leading to limited stocks of vedalan red onions in the wholesale market, priced between Rs.230.00 – 240.00/kg. In February, 5,184 mt of red onions were imported from India, 612 mt less than in the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.151.39/kg, a decrease of Rs.76.66/kg from the previous month. Consequently, wholesale and retail prices of imported red onions dropped by about Rs.84.00/kg and Rs.121.00/kg, respectively. Compared to the same period last year, the retail price of imported red onions has decreased by about 24%.

#### 2.3 Potato

#### **Crop Situation**

The targeted extent for potato cultivation in the Maha 2023/24 season is 2,923 ha, lower than last year's target of 3,202 ha. By the end of February, 1,311 ha had been cultivated, reaching 45% of this season's target. However, compared to the same period in the previous Maha season, the cultivated extent this season represents 105% of last year's level by February's end. Despite this, overall progress remains below the targeted extent for the 2023/24 season.

In the Nuwara Eliya district, the targeted extent is 1,361 ha, with 513 ha cultivated by the end of February, achieving 37% of the target. In the Badulla district, the target is 1,451 ha, with 798 ha cultivated by the end of February, reaching 54% of the target.

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

In February, 17,952 mt of potatoes were imported, an increase of 1,707 mt compared to the previous month and 3,694 mt more than the same period last year. The average CIF price in February was Rs.71/kg (Table 2.3.1).

In the Colombo wholesale market, sufficient stocks of Nuwara Eliya potatoes and limited stocks of Welimada potatoes were available. The average producer prices were Rs.279/kg for Nuwara Eliya potatoes and Rs.244/kg for Welimada potatoes. In February, wholesale and retail prices for Nuwara Eliya potatoes showed a slight decrease compared to January 2024, while the wholesale price of imported potatoes dropped by 22%. Wholesale prices for Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes ranged from Rs.300.00–350.00/kg and Rs.110.00–220.00/kg, respectively. Compared to the same period last year, current retail prices for Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes have risen by 13% and 8%, respectively (Table 2.3.2).

#### 2.4 Green gram and Cowpea

#### **Crop Situation**

The cultivated extent of cowpea reported over 80% progress toward its target, while green gram reached 56% of its target. In contrast, potato cultivation progress remains lower than the targeted extent for the 2023/24 Maha season. Major producing areas for green gram include Hambantota, Moneragala, Kurunegala, and Ampara, while Ampara, Moneragala, and Kurunegala are key production areas for cowpea.

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

Wholesale and retail prices of green gram ranged from Rs.950–1,200/kg and Rs.1,100–1,400/kg, respectively. Retail prices for white and red cowpeas were between Rs.1,200–1,300/kg and Rs.1,100–1,300/kg, respectively. Compared to the previous month, green gram prices have risen by 5%.

#### 2.5 Red dhal

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

The wholesale price of red dhal ranged from Rs.290–300/kg, with an average of Rs.295/kg, while retail prices ranged from Rs.300–360/kg, averaging Rs.338/kg. Compared to the previous month, wholesale and retail prices remained unchanged. However, compared to the previous year, there was a slight increase of 12% in wholesale prices and 9% in retail prices.

#### 3. VEGETABLES

#### **Crop Situation**

The cultivation progress for up-country and low-country vegetables is recorded at 77% (14,183 ha) and 80% (22,246 ha), respectively. Notably, carrot, radish, brinjal, ash plantain, kekiri, and winged bean have all reported progress exceeding 80% of their respective targets. However, the cultivated area for all vegetables is lower than the average extent observed in the past three Maha seasons. Additionally, 146 hectares of up-country vegetables and 91 hectares of low-country vegetables have been affected by floods, pests, and diseases (Crop Forecast, Vol. 03, Maha 2023/2024, Socio Economics & Planning Center/Department of Agriculture).

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

Prices for most vegetables have decreased due to increased supply from major producing areas. Wholesale prices for up-country vegetables have fallen by 9% to 46%, with the most significant decrease reported for carrots, which are priced at Rs.450.00/kg, ranging from Rs.350.00 to Rs.1,000.00/kg. Prices for beetroot, radish, and cabbage also decreased by 20%.

In the case of low-country vegetables, wholesale prices have decreased by 4% to 57%, except for capsicum, pumpkin, cucumber, and ash plantain. Capsicum recorded the highest price at Rs.759.00/kg, while cucumber had the lowest at Rs.88.00/kg. Conversely, the price of tomatoes increased by 41% due to reduced supply from producing areas.

Compared to the same period last year, wholesale prices for most vegetable varieties have risen by 11% to 707%, with cabbage showing the highest price increase. However, prices for green chili and lime have decreased by 22% and 35%, respectively.

In conjunction with the increase in wholesale prices, retail prices for most vegetable varieties have also decreased, with reductions ranging from 5% to 43%. The highest price decrease was observed for brinjal, which is now priced at Rs.308.00/kg. Capsicum reported the highest average retail price at Rs.1,086.00/kg, while cucumber had the lowest price at Rs.206.00/kg.

Conversely, prices for tomatoes and pumpkins have increased by 32% and 34%, respectively. Additionally, the price of lime has decreased by 32%. Compared to the same period last year, retail prices for most vegetable varieties have risen by 35% to 285%, with cabbage experiencing the highest price increase.

#### 4. Fruits

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

In February, wholesale prices for all fruit varieties increased, except for bananas, passion fruit, oranges, and slime apples. Prices for all sizes of pineapples rose by 17% to 20% due to low stock levels resulting from decreased cultivation in the Gampaha district. The monthly average wholesale prices were Rs.759.00 for large pineapples, Rs.587.00 for medium, and Rs.469.00 for small sizes. Among mango varieties, only the Karthakolomban was available, and due to low stock levels following the end of the harvesting period, its price surged by 176%.

For banana varieties, prices decreased for kolikuttu (26%), ambul (26%), ambun (10%), seeni (9%), and anamalu (5%). During the month, wholesale prices ranged from Rs.200.00 to Rs.300.00/kg for kolikuttu, Rs.800.00 to Rs.1,500.00/kg for ambul, Rs.80.00 to Rs.150.00/kg for seeni, Rs.28.00 to Rs.38.00/fruit for ambun, and Rs.25.00 to Rs.34.00/fruit for anamalu.

Among other fruit varieties, wood apple saw the highest price increase at 92% due to off-season conditions. Prices for avocado, imported grapes, and papaw also increased by 37%, 26%, and 6%, respectively, due to low stock levels. Additionally, prices for orange and slime apple decreased by 52% and 45%, respectively (Table 4.1).

Compared to the same period last year, wholesale prices for all fruit varieties have increased, with the highest rise of 93% reported for avocado (Table 4.1).

According to the price behavior observed in the wholesale market, retail prices for most fruit varieties increased in February. All sizes of pineapples saw a price rise of 17% to 19%, with prices ranging from Rs.430.00 to Rs.900.00/fruit in Colombo suburb markets. Regarding banana varieties, prices decreased for ambul (13%), kolikuttu (12%), anamalu (9%), and ambun (8%) bananas. During the month, prices ranged from Rs.280.00 to Rs.500.00/kg for kolikuttu, Rs.150.00 to Rs.280.00/kg for ambul bananas, and Rs.120.00 to Rs.260.00/kg for seeni bananas in Colombo and surrounding markets.

For other fruit varieties, retail prices increased for wood apple (52%), avocado (18%), and passion fruit (17%), while prices for orange (51%) and slime apple (12%) decreased, reflecting trends in the wholesale market. Compared to the same period last year, retail prices for all fruit varieties have risen, with the highest increase of 59% reported for papaw (Table 4.2).

#### **Exports/Imports of Fruits**

According to Sri Lanka Customs, Sri Lanka exported 1,565 mt of fresh fruits in February 2024, valued at Rs.194 million. Notably, 96% of the exported quantity consisted of papaw. This represents an increase in exported quantity compared to February 2023, when 660 mt were exported (Table 4.3).

Regarding imports, Sri Lanka imported 684 mt of fresh fruits during the same month, with a total value of Rs.294 million. Grapes were the most imported fruit, accounting for 307 mt, followed by apples at 197 mt. This reflects a decrease in imported quantity compared to February 2023, when 709 mt were imported (Table 4.4).

Headline inflation, measured by the year-on-year (Y-o-Y) change in the Colombo Consumer Price Index (CCPI, 2021=100), decelerated to 5.9% in February 2024, down from 6.4% in January 2024. Food inflation accelerated to 3.5% in February 2024, compared to 3.3% in January, while non-food inflation decreased to 7.0% in February from 7.9% in January.

In line with a slight deflation in food prices, most fish varieties experienced a further decrease in wholesale prices due to abundant supplies from the Southern and Western Coastal areas, driven by favorable dry and non-windy weather conditions. Additionally, the Eastern coastal belt saw heightened supply during the lean season, supported by good fishing weather.

In February, wholesale prices for most fish varieties, except for salaya, kelawalla, paraw, and small shrimp, declined. The most significant price drop was recorded for balaya, which fell by 12%, followed by thora at a decrease of 10%. High supplies of deep-sea fish varieties such as balaya and thora were noted across all fishing districts due to the favorable fishing conditions. Other fish varieties, apart from salaya, kelawalla, paraw, and small shrimp, dropped by less than 2%. Conversely, prices for salaya, kelawalla, paraw, and small shrimp increased slightly, ranging from 1% to 7%.

Compared to the same period last year, wholesale prices for most fresh fish varieties increased, with rises between 3% and 18%. The most notable increase was seen in thalapath, which rose by 18%. Reflecting variations in the wholesale market, retail prices for most fish varieties, except for salaya, hurulla, and small shrimp, decreased. The largest retail price drop was for balaya at 17%, followed by thora and paraw at 4%. In comparison to the previous year, retail prices for most fresh fish varieties also fell, with the most significant decline recorded for balaya at 21%.

#### **Dried Fish**

#### **Prices and Supply/Demand Situation**

In February 2024, prices for most dried fish varieties experienced a slight decline at the wholesale level. The largest drop was recorded for imported sprats, which fell by 8%, followed by balaya at 7%, and sprats at 4%. However, the prices of other dried fish varieties increased by less than 6%, with the only notable rise being a 6% increase for salaya during the month. Compared to the same period last year, wholesale prices for most dried fish varieties increased, with sprats seeing the highest rise at 20%.

Reflecting the variations in wholesale prices, retail prices for most dried fish varieties also saw a slight decrease. The most significant retail price drop was for imported sprats at 9%. Additionally, prices for all other fish varieties, except for sprats, kattawa, and salaya, dropped by less than 4%. In contrast, retail prices for salaya and sprats increased by 3% and 2%, respectively. Compared to the same period last year, retail prices for most dried fish varieties fell, with the most significant decreases reported for imported sprats and kattawa, both dropping by 9%.

Due to the low availability of imported, low-priced eggs, prices began to rise in February. Both brown and white eggs saw an increase of 11%, with average prices recorded at Rs. 59.00 for brown eggs and Rs. 56.70 for white eggs. Consequently, retail prices for both types of eggs also rose, by 9% for brown eggs and 10% for white eggs. By February, the average retail prices had increased to Rs. 60.60 for brown eggs and Rs. 58.30 for white eggs.

When compared to the same period last year, the retail prices for both brown and white eggs increased significantly, by 30% and 28%, respectively.

In February, prices for most meat varieties experienced a slight increase in the retail market compared to January. The most significant rise was observed in chicken (curry), which saw a 12% increase. Both beef (without bones) and mutton also saw a modest increase of 1%. However, chicken (broiler) experienced a price drop of 4% during the month. Compared to the same period last year, prices for most meat varieties rose, with mutton recording the highest increase at 10%.
