Highlights

Rice

Despite the reduction in prices for key paddy varieties, the rice market did not reflect this change during the month, primarily due to a shortage in rice supplies. Consequently, wholesale prices for all local rice varieties, excluding red raw, experienced a further increase compared to the previous month. Notably, Keeri samba recorded the highest price hike at Rs. 17.16/kg. Samba grade I and II witnessed wholesale prices ranging from Rs. 205.00-220.00 and Rs. 200.00-215.00/kg, respectively, during the month.

In the current month, retail prices for all local rice varieties, excluding raw red, have seen an increase in the range of 1-5% compared to the previous month. This rise can be attributed to diminished supplies. Furthermore, when compared to the same month last year, retail prices for all varieties have witnessed an escalation within the range of 6-45%, with imported *Ponni* samba experiencing the highest price surge.

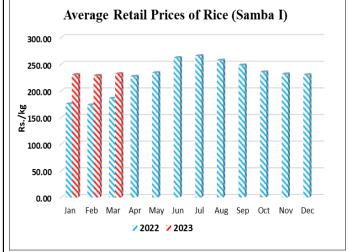
Vegetables

Due to an increase in market supply, wholesale prices for the majority of upcountry and low-country vegetables have experienced a decrease. Wholesale prices for up-country vegetables have notably decreased by 3%-39%, excluding cabbage. The most significant price reduction was observed in beans, with a decrease of 39%. Among up-country vegetables, beans also exhibited the highest recorded price of Rs. 202.00/kg, while radish reported the lowest at Rs. 53.00/kg.

Consistent with the fluctuations in wholesale prices, retail prices for the majority of vegetable varieties have experienced a decrease. Retail prices for up-country vegetables notably saw a decline of 7%-31%. Capsicum reported the highest retail price at Rs. 505.00/kg, while pumpkin recorded the lowest at Rs. 147.00/kg.

Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Due to lower food inflation and abundant supply resulting from favorable weather conditions, the prices of most fish varieties have experienced a further decline in both wholesale and retail markets. However, the retail prices of both types of eggs have increased due to a shortage that occurred after the implementation of maximum retail prices (MRP) for brown eggs at Rs. 46.00 and white eggs at Rs. 44.00.

1. Paddy/Rice

Crop Situation

According to the Department of Agriculture, the sown area of paddy in March 2023 remains consistent with the year-on-year basis, totaling 809,350 hectares. The projected paddy production, estimated at 2.63 million metric tons, takes into account crop losses. Various factors, including yellowing, pest and diseases, floods, and other reasons, have affected a total area of 112,379 hectares. The impact is notably concentrated in the Batticaloa district and Mahaweli systems C, B, and G.

Cultivation efforts have nearly achieved the set targets in regions such as Colombo, Vavuniya, Polonnaruwa IP, Anuradhapura IP, and Mahaweli Systems H, H1, D, L, and Udawalawa.

Producer Prices

Producer prices of short grain, long grain white and long grain red paddy varieties have shown a decreasing trend in all major producing areas during the month. Harvesting of paddy in *Maha*, 2022/23 season was in progress in the producing areas in the Eastern province and Kurunegala and Anuradhapura districts. Prices of short grain and long grain white were ranged between Rs.85.00-110.00/Kg and Rs.77.00-102.00/Kg respectively. The lowest prices for long grain white was recorded in Kalawewa. Producer prices of Keeri samba ranged between Rs. 100.00 - 129.50/kg in all the major producing areas.

Compared to last month, the average producer prices of short grain and long grain white varieties have decreased in all most all the major producing areas. The lowest price for the short grain white paddy was recorded in Kalawewa and Kurunegala while the highest was recorded in Polonnaruwa and Ampara. Compared to the same period of last year, the prices of short grain, long grain white and long grain red have decreased in all most all the major producing areas.

Rice Prices Demand/Supply Situation

Wholesale Prices

Despite the reduction in prices for key paddy varieties, the rice market did not reflect this change during the month, primarily due to a shortage in rice supplies. Consequently, wholesale prices for all local rice varieties, excluding red raw, experienced a further increase compared to the previous month. Notably, Keeri samba recorded the highest price hike at Rs. 17.16/kg. Samba grade I and II witnessed wholesale prices ranging from Rs. 205.00-220.00 and Rs. 200.00-215.00/kg, respectively, during the month.

Moreover, wholesale prices for all imported rice varieties saw an increase in the range of 2-8%, attributed to elevated import costs. In contrast, the wholesale price of raw red decreased by 4% compared to the previous month, with prices ranging between Rs. 155.00-180.00/kg.

In a year-on-year comparison, wholesale prices for all rice varieties, except raw red, saw a substantial increase of 8-64%. The imported samba variety recorded the highest price surge at 64%.

Retail Prices

In the current month, retail prices for all local rice varieties, excluding raw red, have seen an increase in the range of 1-5% compared to the previous month. This rise can be attributed to diminished supplies. Furthermore, when compared to the same month last year, retail prices for all varieties have witnessed an escalation within the range of 6-45%, with imported *Ponni* samba experiencing the highest price surge.

2. Other Field Crops

2.1 Chilli

Crop Situation and Progress

In the Maha 2022/23 season, the targeted land extent for green chilli cultivation was set at 11,214 hectares. However, by the end of the season, only 7,836 hectares were cultivated, accounting for 70% of the target. Notably, the Anuradhapura district recorded both the highest targeted extent (1,776 hectares) and cultivated extent (667 hectares) by the end of the month. Surprisingly, despite this, the Monaragala district yielded the highest expected production at 11,605 metric tons.

In March alone, approximately 400 hectares of green chilli were cultivated across the country. Nevertheless, there is a notable 4% increase in the cultivated extent by the end of this Maha season compared to the last one.

Based on the cultivated extent up to the end of the season, the anticipated green chilli production for this Maha season is estimated to be 87,778 metric tons. Notably, around 46% of this production is expected to come from Anuradhapura (7%), Puttalam (10%), Jaffna (10%), Monaragala (13%), and Inter Provincial DDA areas (6%).

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The supply of green chilli from the main producing areas has decreased during this month. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of green chilli have increased by about Rs.37.00/kg and Rs.11.00/kg respectively. Average wholesale and retail prices of green chilli were Rs.310.50/kg and Rs.490.66/kg respectively. Higher producer prices for green chilli were recorded from the Embilipitiya area with the price range of Rs.317.00 - 358.00/kg during the month of March. Compared to the same period of last year, wholesale price of green chillies has increased by about 1% while the retail price has decreased by about 6%.

A quantity of 3,408 mt of dried chillie was imported in March, 2023 and this quantity was less than 816mt compared to the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.723.55/kg and it has decreased by Rs.89.54/kg compared to the previous month. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chillies have decreased by about Rs.116.00/kg and Rs.185.00/kg respectively. Prices ranged between Rs.950.00-1220.00/kg at the wholesale level and Rs.1100.00 – Rs. 1600.00/kg at the retail level. Compared to the same period last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilli have increased by about 5% and 20% respectively.

2.2 Red Onion and Big Onion Crop situation and Progress

The targeted extent of land for red onion for maha 2022/23 season was 3575ha, of which 1,879ha has been cultivated by the end of the maha season. It represented 53% of the targeted extent of red onion in Sri Lanka. The targeted extent of land cultivation with red onion was about, 1900 ha in Jaffna and 1417ha of the target (75%) was grown at the end of March 2023. In March about 361 ha of red onion was cultivated in Jaffna while no cultivation was recorded in Puttalam district. The cultivation progress of red onion in Puttalam district was 25% of the targeted extent at the end of March 2023. Compared to last maha season, the cultivated extent by the end of this maha

season has decreased by about 14% in Sri Lanka. According to the cultivated extent up to end of the season, the expected production of red onion is 23136mt and out of that around 90% of the production will be supplied from Jaffna (76%), and Puttalam (14%).

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The market supply of big onion consisted of only imported and big onions during this month too. A quantity of 30,172mt of big onion was imported in March 2023 and this quantity was higher than the 6,965 mt compared to the previous month. The average CIF price was Rs.61.75/kg and it has decreased by Rs.11.59/kg compared to the previous month. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onions have decreased by about Rs.17.00/kg and Rs.32.00/kg respectively. The average wholesale and retail prices of imported big onion were Rs.94.18/kg and Rs.126.33/kg respectively and both prices have decreased by about 26% and 28% respectively when compared to the same period of last year.

The supply of local red onion has increased from the main producing areas during this month. Hence wholesale prices of sinnan and vedalan red onion have decreased by about Rs.47.00/kg and Rs.81.00/kg respectively. In line with the wholesale price, retail price of vedalan has also decreased by about Rs.54.00/kg and prices range between Rs.320.00 -360.00/kg for sinnan and Rs.360.00- 560.00/kg for vedalan. A quantity of 1,341mt of red onion was imported from India during this month and it was a decrease of 248 mt compared to that of last month. The average CIF price was Rs.109.33/kg and it has decreased by Rs. 19.01/kg compared to the previous month. With the availability of ample stocks of local red onion in the market, both wholesale and retail prices of imported red onions have decreased by about Rs.12.00/kg and Rs.102.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, retail prices of sinnan, vedalan and imported red onions have increased by about 28%, 17% and 13% respectively.

2.3 Potato

Crop Situation and Progress

The targeted extent of potato for *Maha* 2022/23 season is 3,202 ha and about 1,682ha had been cultivated by the end of the season achieving 53% of the target. Potato cultivation did not achieve the targeted cultivation extent by the season's end. However, when compared to last *Maha* season cultivation extent of *Maha* 2022/23 is recorded as 102%. The major reason for this drastic drop in the potato cultivation with the target is mainly due to the high seed cost due to the prevailing economic crisis.

However, compared to last maha season, the cultivated extent by the end of this maha season has increased by 102%. According to the cultivated extent up to the end of the season, the expected potato production is 27,140 mt for this maha season (Table 2.3.1). In the Nuwara Eliya district, the targeted extent is 1,526 ha and about 782 ha of potato had been cultivated by the end of the season (51% progress). The targeted extent for this maha season is 1,533 ha in the Badulla district and 861 ha had been cultivated by the end of the season achieving the targeted extent by 56%.

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

A quantity of 20, 479 mt of potato had been imported in March, which was 6,221 mt higher than that was imported during the previous month. Average CIF price was Rs.56 /kg in March (Table 2.3.2). With regard to local potato, sufficient stocks of Nuwara Eliya and Welimada potatoes were available in the Colombo Wholesale market. In March, the wholesale prices of Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potatoes have decreased by 11% and 13% respectively. Further, the retail prices of Welimada potatoes have increased by 4% and retail prices Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes have decreased by 1% and 14% respectively.

During the month of March, the wholesale prices of Welimada, Nuwara Eliya and imported potatoes ranged between Rs. 180.00-200.00/kg, Rs. 210.00-230.00/kg and Rs. 95.00-130.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of Welimada (26%), Nuwara Eliya (22%) and imported (1%) potatoes have increased (Table 2.3.3).

2.4 Green gram and Cowpea

Crop Situation and Progress

The cultivated extent Green gram and Cowpea has increased (by114% and 113% respectively). Both cowpea and black gram reported above 80% progress from the targets. It was recorded that the Hambanthota, Moneragala, Kurunegala, Ampara, Anuradhapura and Putthalam districts are the major producing areas for the Green gram cultivation while Ampara, Anuradapura, Kurunegala and Moneragala Vavuniya are for Cowpea.

Prices and Supply/ Demand Situation

The wholesale and retail prices of green gram ranged Rs 1350.00-1450.00 /kg and Rs 600.00-1200/kg respectively. Meanwhile, the retail prices of White and Red Cowpea ranged between Rs 850.00-1450.00/kg and 850.00-1400.00 /kg respectively. When compared to the previous month, prices of green gram increased by 1%. The price of red and white cowpea decrease by 10% and 13% respectively.

2.5 Red dhal

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The wholesale price of red dhal ranged between Rs.305/kg and Rs.340/kg with an average of Rs.323.93/kg, and the retail price ranged between Rs.320/kg and Rs.380/kg with an average of Rs.360.69/kg. Compared with the last year wholesale and retail prices have increased by 9% and 5% respectively.

In March 2023, 15,324 mt were imported and the highest imports is from Australia. The average CIF price recorded as Rs. 237/kg

3. Vegetables

Crop Situation

Cultivation progress of up-country and low-country vegetables are recorded as 87% (17,694ha) and 85% (23,974ha) respectively. Beans, carrot, knol-khol, leeks, pumpkin, brinjal and winged bean reported above 90% progress from their targets. Carrot and pumpkin exceeded their target as their cultivation progress reported as 102% and 105% respectively. (Crop Forecast, Vol.05, *Maha* 2022/2023, Socio-Economics & Planning Center/Department of Agriculture).

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Due to an increase in market supply, wholesale prices for the majority of up-country and low-country vegetables have experienced a decrease. Wholesale prices for up-country vegetables have notably decreased by 3%-39%, excluding cabbage. The most significant price reduction was observed in beans, with a decrease of 39%. Among up-country vegetables, beans also exhibited the highest recorded price of Rs. 202.00/kg, while radish reported the lowest at Rs. 53.00/kg. Similarly, wholesale prices for low-country vegetables have witnessed a decline of 1%-53%, with the exception of brinjal, which experienced a 4% increase. Among low-country vegetables, capsicum reached the highest price at Rs. 323.00/kg, while pumpkin had the lowest at Rs. 50.00/kg.

In a year-on-year comparison, wholesale prices for most vegetable varieties have increased by 5%-251%, with the most significant surge reported for ash plantain at 251%. However, prices for carrot, cabbage, tomato, and pumpkin have decreased, ranging from 17%-56%.

Consistent with the fluctuations in wholesale prices, retail prices for the majority of vegetable varieties have experienced a decrease. Retail prices for up-country vegetables notably saw a decline of 7%-31%. Capsicum reported the highest retail price at Rs. 505.00/kg, while pumpkin recorded the lowest at Rs. 147.00/kg.

However, it's worth noting that there were exceptions to this trend, with the prices of green chilli and lime witnessing increases of 2% and 8%, respectively.

4. Fruits

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

In March, the wholesale prices of most of the fruit varieties have increased. Considering the prices of banana varieties, the prices of anamalu (28%), ambun (20%), kolikuttu (17%) and seeni (7%) banana have increased, while the price of ambul (2%) has decreased. During the month, the wholesale prices ranged between Rs.330.00-480.00/kg (kolikuttu), Rs.140.00-220.00/kg (ambul), Rs.100.00-160.00/kg (seeni), Rs.29.00-40.00/fruit (ambun) and Rs.25.00-35.00/fruit (anamalu). Prices of all the sizes of pineapple have increased further in the range of 54%-62% due to lean harvesting season for pineapple in Gampaha district. Monthly average wholesale prices were Rs.695.00/fruit (large), Rs.594.00/fruit (medium) and Rs.484.00/fruit (small) sizes of fruits respectively. Considering the mango varieties, the price of karthakolomban mango has decreased by 35% due to arrival of ample stocks from major producing areas.

Considering the other types of fruit varieties, the highest price increase was recorded for orange (49%). Further, the prices of slime apple, papaw and wood apple have increased by 29%, 23% and 17% respectively. However, the prices of avocado and passion fruit have decreased by 17% due to on-going harvesting season.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current wholesale prices of all the fruit varieties have increased with the highest price increase of 212% reported for *ambul* banana (Table 4.1).

According to the price behaviour of the wholesale market, the retail prices of most of the fruit varieties have increased in March. Considering the price behaviour for banana varieties, the highest price increase of 9% was reported for *kolikuttu* banana and the prices of *anamalu, seeni* and *ambun* banana have increased by 3%. During the month, the prices ranged between Rs.380.00-580.00/kg for *kolikuttu*, Rs.180.00-280.00/kg for *ambul* banana and Rs.160.00-250.00/kg for *seeni* banana in Colombo and suburb markets. Considering the price behaviour for pineapple varieties, the prices of all the sizes have increased in the range of 27%-36% due to increased wholesale prices and the prices ranged between Rs.450.00-760.00/fruit in Colombo suburbs markets. Among the mango varieties, the price of *karthakolomban* has decreased by 26% due to availability of ample stocks in the market.

Considering the other types of fruits, the retail prices of orange (22%), papaw (12%) and wood apple (7%) have increased due to decreased supply. However, the prices of avocado (21%) and passion fruit (14%) have decreased due to decreased wholesale price. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of all the fruit varieties have increased with the highest price increase of 118% reported for *karthakolomban* mango (Table 4.2).

Exports/Imports of Fruits

According to Sri Lanka Customs, Sri Lanka had exported 832 mt of fresh fruits in March, 2023 to the value of Rs.213 mn. Of the exported quantity, 89% were papaw and 6% were fresh pineapple. Compared to March 2022 (1,338 mt), the exported quantity had decreased during this year (Table 4.3).

With reference to imports, Sri Lanka had imported 968 mt of fresh fruits during the month and the value was Rs.431 mn. Apple was the mostly imported fruit type with the quantity of 546 mt, followed by grapes (305 mt). Compared to the month of March, 2022 (2,860 mt), the imported quantity had significantly decreased during this year (Table 4.4).

5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The Food inflation (Y-o-Y) had decreased further to 47.6% in March 2023 from 54.4 % in February 2023, leading to a slight decrease in the prices of all fish varieties, except for mora and balaya at the wholesale level compared to the previous month. Further, there was an increase in supply during the main fishing season in the southern coastal and deep-sea fishing season and improved weather conditions. As mentioned earlier, due to the rise in the cost of living and loss of income, consumers have been compelled to reduce their consumption of high-value foods such as fish and meat, leading to a decrease in demand for these products. Additionally, a shift in demand from high-value fish varieties to low-value ones has also been observed.

Among all the fresh fish varieties, the largest price drop was observed for thalapath as 9%, followed by thora as 4%, and salaya as 3%. Equally, prices for most of the remaining fish varieties, with the exception of mora and balaya had been decreased within the range of 1% to 2%. As mentioned earlier, the economic crisis induced demand shift from high-value fish varieties to low-value ones have been observed. For instance, the price of hurulla and salaya which had been increasing for several consecutive months, in the last year, showed a slight drop in March due to high supply. In comparison to the same period in the previous year, wholesale prices for most fresh fish varieties had increased, ranging from 4% to 42%, with the most notable increase seen in the price of salaya as 42%.

As a result of the wholesale price changes, the retail prices for most of the fish varieties have decreased in comparison to the previous month. The largest price drop was for thora as 7%. Next,

prices of shrimps (small), thalapatha and hurulla had dropped by 6%. However, prices of mora kelawalla and hurulla had increased in the range of 1% - 6%. When compared to the same period of the previous year, retail prices for all fresh fish varieties have increased, with the most significant increase noted for salaya as 59%.

Dried Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

In March 2023, prices of most dried fish varieties also experienced a decrease in prices following the drop in prices of the common fresh fish varieties.

The highest price drop at the wholesale level was recorded for salaya as 9% due to low fresh fish prices. Further, prices of both sprats and sprats (imported) had dropped by 8%. The prices of remaining dried fish varieties, except for balaya and anguluwa (imported) had dropped in the range of by 2% - 6%. However, prices of balaya had increased slightly, by 2%. Compared to the same period of the last year, wholesale prices of most of the dried fish varieties had increased, with the highest price increase noted for anguluwa (imported) as 38%.

During the same period, the retail prices of most dried fish varieties had slightly decreased, which could be attributed to the price drops observed in the wholesale market. The highest price drop was reported for sprats (imported) as 7%. Prices of other fish varieties, except for mora and kattawa had shown a slight price drop in the range of 4% - 5%. Compared to the same period of

the last year, retail prices of all the dried fish varieties had increased significantly, with the highest price increase noted for anguluwa as 40%.

Eggs

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The Consumer Affairs Authority issued a new Gazette notification on January 20th, 2023, renewing the maximum retail price (MRP) for eggs. According to the new MRP, white eggs must be sold at Rs. 44, while brown eggs must be sold at Rs. 46. In the wholesale market, prices of both brown and white eggs had remained the same, compared to last month. The recorded average prices were Rs. 46.00 per egg and Rs. 44.00 per egg for brown and white eggs at the wholesale market.

After the implementation of new pricing regulations, a shortage of brown and white eggs occurred in the retail market. The few retail outlets that had eggs available experienced a notable price hike compared to the previous month. Consequently, the retail prices for both brown and white eggs saw significant increases, rising by 23% and 12% respectively. When comparing to the same period last year, the wholesale and retail prices of eggs had surged by over 50%.

Meat

Compared to February, prices of most of the meat varieties had slightly decreased at the retail market. The highest price drop was noted for pork as 5%. Next, prices of chicken curry had dropped by1%. However, prices of mutton and chicken (broiler) had remained the same while the price of beef (without bones) recording a price hike of 4%.

Compared to last year, prices of all the meat varieties had increased with the highest was reported for pork as 84%.

6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

Wheat grain and Wheat flour

A Total quantity of 110,419mt of wheat grain, worth of 13,505mn had been imported during March. Compared to the quantity imported in previous month, the quantity imported in this month has increased by around 32,818mt. Wheat grain was mainly imported from Ukraine (49%) and Romania(51%) at a CIF price of Rs.118.41/kg and Rs.126.08/kg respectively. Compared to the previous month, average CIF price has decreased by Rs.22.26/kg. The highest CIF price was for wheat grain imported from Romania whilst the lowest CIF price was for wheat grain imported from Ukraine.

Total Quantity of wheat flour imported in this month was 6,009mt, worth 1,008mn. Compared to the previous month, this month quantity has decreased by around 15,462mt. The highest quantity of wheat flour has imported from Turkey at a CIF price of Rs.164.73/kg and that was 83% of the total quantity of wheat flour imported in March. Remain quantity has imported from India (11%), UAE (4%) and few quantities from China and Singapore. Average CIF price of wheat flour

imported in this month was Rs.167.68/kg and compared to the previous month it has decreased by Rs.19.59/kg.

Meanwhile, the local retail price of wheat flour ranged from Rs.226.61-245.56/kg and the average price was Rs.227.04/kg. Compared to last month, the average retail price of wheat flour has decreased by 7% and compared to the same period of last year, price has increased by 33%.

Sugar

Total quantity of sugar imported in this month was 21,412mt worth 4,238mn and it has increased by around 10,759mt when compared to the quantity imported in February. The largest quantity of sugar was mainly imported from India and that was 95% of the total quantity. Rest of quantity has imported from Pakistan (4%),UAE(0.6%) and Malaysia. The average CIF price was Rs.197.93/kg and compared to the previous month it has decreased by Rs.10.81/kg. The highest CIF price was paid for sugar imported from Malaysia (Rs.375.20/kg) while the lowest was paid for sugar imported from India (Rs.197.54/kg).

Referring to the local retail price of sugar for the month, price ranged from Rs.217.32-237.36/kg and the average retail price was Rs.219.38/kg. Compared to the last month, average retail price has decreased by 6% and compared to the same period of last year price has increased by 28%.
