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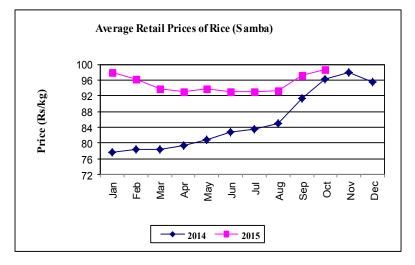

RICE:

Paddy prices have increased in every rice producing areas due to the availability of high quality stocks in the market and high demand for the prevailed paddy stocks in the market. As a result of that, the prices of all the local rice varieties have increased during this month.

VEGETABLES:

As the *Yala* harvesting season approaches its end phase, supplies have gradually reduced from both up and lowcountry major producing areas. As a result, the prices of most of the upcountry and lowcountry varieties have increased by 35% compared to last month. As off season has approached, a considerable price increase is anticipated in coming month.

1. Paddy

Crop Situation

Rainy weather was experienced in all major producing areas throughout the month due to the onset of North West monsoons. Land preparation activities for paddy cultivation in 2015/16 *Maha* season were commenced in most of the producing areas with the beginning of the rains. According to the rainfall data October rainfall was higher than their 30 year mean values in most of the major producing areas. However land preparation activities were delayed in some areas due to the flood situation as a result of the heavy rains. Peak crop establishment activities can be expected during the end of next month. According to the latest crop forecast report of the Agriculture Department, the targeted extents of paddy in this *Maha* season are 835,786ha and the highest targets were recorded from Anuradhapura, Kurunegala, Ampara and Batticaloa. The prospects of the paddy harvest of last *Yala* season were satisfactory in all major producing districts. Prevailed favorable weather condition, better water availability in irrigation tanks and low pest and deceases caused the progress of paddy cultivation.

Producer Prices

During last 2015 *Yala* season a bumper harvest reached to the market from most of the major producing areas until the end of September. The open market prices of all the paddy varieties have shown an increasing trend during the month in most of the major producing areas due to the impact of the government paddy purchasing programme. In order to stabilized the prices of long grain red paddy the government paddy purchasing programme continuously progress in Hambantota, Tissamaharama and Embilipitiya areas during the month. The open market prices of long grain white and short grain were in the range of Rs.28.00-36.00/kg and Rs.38.00-45.00/kg respectively in most of the major producing areas. The lowest prices for long grain white were recorded in Polonnaruwa, Kalawewa, Kurunegala and Dehiattakandiya. Prices of long grain red paddy were in the range of Rs.30.00-33.00/kg in producing areas in the Southern Province. It is expected to that the increasing trend of paddy prices will be continue during the next month.

Compared to the same period of last year, all the paddy varieties have shown a declining trend in most of the producing areas. The prices of short grain have decreased in the range of 4%-11% with the highest decline from Kurunegala. Prices of long grain white have decreased in the range of 20%-31% with the highest decline from Kalawewa. Meanwhile, the prices of long grain red have decreased in the range of 32%-33%.

Rice Demand and Supply Situation

Wholesale prices

It was reported that the paddy cultivation of 2015/16 *maha* season has been started in most of the rice producing areas during this month. Also, the paddy purchasing in 2015 *yala* season has been completely ended by this month.

Paddy prices have increased in every rice producing areas due to the availability of high quality stocks in the market and high demand for the prevailed paddy stocks in the market. As a result of that, the prices of all the local rice varieties have increased during this month. The highest price increase was reported for raw white and it was 5%. Furthermore, the prices have increased by 4% for nadu grade I, by 2% for nadu grade II, samba grade I and II, by 1% for raw red and samba grade III. According to the statistical data released by the Department of Customs, rice imports have decreased by 50% compared to the last month and it was reported as 2,288mt. But, the price of imported *ponni* samba has slightly decreased due to the low demand in this month.

Compared to the same period of last year, the wholesale prices have increased by 2% for samba grade I and by 56% for imported *ponni* samba. The prices of all the other local rice varieties have decreased by 1%-25%.

Retail

Prices of most of the rice varieties have increased in the retail market too. The price of samba grade I has increased by Rs.2.00/kg while the prices of nadu, raw white, samba grade II and III have increased by less than Rs.1.00/kg. Price of raw red has decreased by Rs.1.00/kg. Also, the price of imported *ponni* samba has increased by Rs.3.00/kg. The highest price of Rs.125.00/kg was reported for imported *ponni* samba and the lowest price of Rs.60.00/kg was reported for both raw red and raw white.

Referring to the retail prices of the outstation markets except Colombo, the highest price range of Rs.91.00-109.00/kg for samba varieties was reported in Kegalle and Rathnapura markets while the lowest price range of Rs.78.00-85.00/kg was reported in Killinochchi and Dehiattakandiya markets. The highest price range of Rs.72.00-79.00/kg for nadu rice was noted in Gampaha market and the lowest price range of Rs.59.00-61.00/kg was noted in Polonnaruwa and Puttalam markets. Also, the highest price of Rs.78.00/kg for raw red and that of Rs.70.00/kg for raw white were reported in Kegalle market. The lowest price of Rs.55.00/kg for raw red was noted in Matara market while that of Rs.58.00/kg for raw white was noted in Dehiattakandiya market.

Compared to the same period of last year, the retail prices of local samba varieties have increased by 2%-3%, followed by imported *ponni* samba as 50%. The prices of all the other local rice varieties have decreased by 14%-20%.

2. Other Field Crops

2.1 Chillies

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Supply of green chilies from Anuradhapura, Monaragala, Puttalam, Matale and Embilipitiya areas had decreased as it was the tail end of the harvesting season. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of green chilies had increased by about Rs.86.00/kg and Rs.78.00/kg respectively. Average wholesale and retail prices of green chillies were Rs.184.62/kg and Rs.317.28/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of the last year, wholesale price and retail price of green chilies had increased by about 148% and 64% respectively.

About 3564mt of dried chilies was imported from India during this month and it was a decrease of 1027mt compared to that of the last month. The average CIF price was Rs.246.91/kg and it was an increase by Rs.27.63/kg.

Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilies have increased by about Rs.13.00/kg and Rs.14.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of imported dried chilies had increased by about 45% and 37% respectively.

2.2 Big Onion and Red Onion

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

The market supply of big onion consisted of both imported and local big onion varieties during this month also. A quantity of 2780mt of big onion was imported in October 2015 (India -1,882 mt (68%), Pakistan -726mt (26%), China – 172 mt (6%). This was about 1,342 mt less compared to the previous month. Average CIF price was Rs.84.78/kg for imported big onion and it was an increase of Rs.38.97/kg compared to the previous month. Though the continued supply of local big onion from Matale district has been recorded during this month also, the quantity had decreased compared to the previous month. Hence, both wholesale and retail prices of local big onion had increased by about Rs.16.00/kg and Rs.5.00/kg respectively. If the government will not reduce the special commodity levy for imported big onion during the next month, the prices of big onion will be increased significantly. Both wholesale and retail prices of imported big onion had also increased by about Rs.26.00/kg and Rs.10.00/kg respectively due to limited imports.

Compared to the same period of last year, both wholesale and retail prices of local big onion had increased by about 50%. The supply of both sinnan and vedalan varieties had decreased from Puttalam and Jaffna areas as it was the tail end of the harvesting season. About 904mt of red onion was imported from India during this month and it was an increase of 583mt compared to that of the previous month. Average CIF price of imported red onion was Rs.106.73/kg and it was an increase of Rs.5.07/kg compared to the last month. Wholesale prices of both sinnan and vedalan had increased by about Rs.47.00/kg and Rs.32.00/kg respectively due to limited supply from main producing areas. The retail price of vedalan has also increased by Rs.7.00/kg while the sinnan stocks were not available at the retail market. Wholesale price and retail price of imported red onion had increased by about Rs.42.00/kg and Rs.6.00/kg respectively due to low availability of local red onion at the market.

Compared to the same period of last year, current retail price of vedalan had increased by about 24%.

2.3 Potato

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

A quantity of 3,575 mt of potato had been imported in October which was 1,513 mt lower than that was imported during the previous month as the Special Commodity Levy for imported potato has been increased up to Rs.40.00/kg with effect from 08/09/2015. Imported stocks were received from Pakistan, India, China and Bangladesh. About 74% of the imported stocks were received from Pakistan during this month. Compared to October, 2014 (2,931 mt), the imports were high during this month. Average CIF price was Rs.32.00/kg in October.

With regard to local potato, the supply has dropped due to end of the peak harvesting season and also the harvesting of potatoes was interrupted due to bad weather condition in major producing areas. Hence, the wholesale prices of both Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potatoes have increased by 3% and 6% respectively. Also, the retail price of Nuwara Eliya potato has increased by 1%, while the retail price of Welimada potato has decreased by 4%. On average, the producer prices of Welimada and Nuwara Eliya potatoes were Rs.82.00/kg and Rs.95.00/kg respectively in October. The wholesale and retail prices of imported potato have increased by 16% and 1% respectively due to decreased imports with increased tax. During the month of October, the wholesale prices of Nuwara Eliya, Welimada and imported potatoes ranged between Rs.80.00-150.00/kg, Rs.75.00-130.00/kg and Rs.75.00-110.00/kg respectively. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of imported (19%) and Nuwara Eliya (18%) potatoes have increased, while the price of Welimada potato (8%) has decreased.

2.4 Green gram and Cowpea

Prices and Supply Demand Situation

A quantity of 802 mt of green gram was imported in October and it was 230 mt increase compared to that of September. The average CIF price was Rs.179.00/kg during this month. About 71% of the imports were received from Australia and the rest was imported from Myanmar and Indonesia. Compared to October, 2014 (110 mt), the imported quantity of green gram was higher during this month. The wholesale and retail prices of green gram have not changed significantly during this month. In October, the wholesale price of green gram ranged between Rs.175.00-210.00/kg. With the arrival of harvest of mid-season cultivation of green gram, the local stocks fetched low price. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail price of green gram had decreased by 23%.

A quantity of 1,140 mt of cowpea was imported in October, which was 425 mt higher than the quantity imported in the previous month. About 57% of the imports were received from Brazil and the rest was imported from Madagascar, Myanmar and India. The average CIF price was Rs.127.00/kg in October. With regard to cowpea, the wholesale prices of white and red cowpea have decreased by 15% and 11% respectively due to availability of ample stocks of local and imported varieties. Also, the retail prices of white cowpea and red cowpea have decreased by 2% and 1% respectively. During the month of October, the wholesale prices of white and red cowpea ranged between Rs.80.00-150.00/kg and Rs.75.00-110.00/kg respectively. Imported stocks fetched high price. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of white and red cowpea had increased by 6% and 21% respectively.

2.5 Red dhal

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

A quantity of 7,822 mt (6,876 mt of whole type and 946 mt of split type) of red dhal was imported in October and it was 2,484 mt lower than the quantity imported in September. About 56% and 35% of the stocks of whole type had been received from Canada and Australia, while 58% and 42% of split type had been received from Canada and Turkey. Compared to October, 2014 (12,913 mt), the imports of red dhal were low during this month. The average CIF price was Rs.127.00/kg in October.

Wholesale and retail prices of red dhal have decreased by 3% and 1% respectively. The average wholesale price was Rs.172.00/kg in October. Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail price of red dhal had increased by 10%.

3. Vegetables

Crop Situation

In October above average rainfall has received in most of the up and mid country districts. Therefore, early commencement of the *Maha* season was evident in most of the up and mid country districts. In Matale district, the targeted extent for *Maha* season is 2,768 ha of which 101 ha was completed by the end of October. In Nuwara Eliya district, the targeted extent for upcountry varieties in the *Maha* season is 5,044 ha of which 741 ha was completed by the end of October, recording an achievement of 15% of the seasonal target. Generally, crop establishment for *Maha* season has progressed well in Kandy districts with the rainy weather experienced in the beginning of the cultivation season. The reported cultivation progress for major vegetables in the district was 15% at the end of October. In Ratnapura district, beans cultivation has recorded 20% progress of the seasonal target, by the end of October.

Crop establishment commenced well in all the lowcountry major producing areas of low country districts with the received rainfall at the beginning of the cultivation season. As almost all irrigation tanks had fairly good storage, water availability for agriculture was at satisfactory level

in October. In Ratnapura district, the targeted extent for lowcountry varieties in the *Maha* season is 1,601 ha and the extent cultivated by the end of October was 331ha, recording a 20% progress. In the meantime, 2015/16 *Maha* season has been advanced by about two weeks in Puttlam district reporting the highest cultivation extent for long beans as 158 ha. In Hambantota district, early establishment of 2015/16 *Maha* cultivation was observed with an extent of 1,554 ha completed by the end of October reporting a 63% increase compared to the same period of the last year. In Anuradhapura district, land preparation for upcoming *Maha* season has been in progress from the second week of September, with the achievement of 1,917 ha.

Prices and supply/Demand situation

As the *Yala* harvesting season has come to an end, the supplies have gradually declined from up and mid country districts. During October, upcountry vegetables were received mainly from Nuwara Eliya, Badulla, Kandy, Matale and Ratnapura. The total supply of vegetables in the Matale district was around 4,146 mt in October, recorded a 47% increase compared to previous month. The highest supply was recorded for long beans and radish as 100 mt for each, during this month. The daily supply of vegetables to the Dambulla Dedicated Economic Centre was around 1,200 -1,500 mt in October, recording a 42% increase compared to last month.

Considering upcountry vegetables, the prices of all the vegetable varieties, except leeks have increased in October, due to decreasing trend in market supplies. The highest price increase was reported for radish as 74%, followed by cabbage as 54% and beans as 44%. Prices of all the other upcountry varieties, except leeks have increased in the range of 9% - 13%, due to low supplies. However, as the rainy weather intensified, *Yala* harvesting season was shortened than expected and it intensified the price increase in October. As off season has approached, low supplies are expected to reach the market and hence a considerable price increase is anticipated in coming month.

With the shortening of *Yala* harvesting season due to rain, supply of tomato has decreased considerably during the latter stage of the season and hence the prices have increased considerably, by 45%. The price of capsicum has also increased by 51% in October.

The supply of most of the lowcountry vegetables has also decreased with the off season for vegetable harvesting and thereby the prices have increased for most of the low country varieties. The highest price increase was recorded for bitter gourd as 56%, followed by long beans as 40%. Prices of other varieties except cucumber and brinjal have increased in a range of 1% - 25%, due to low supplies. With the crop damage occurred due to high intensity of rainfall, farmers have uprooted the existing crops and started land preparation for *Maha* season. As off season has approached, low supplies are expected to reach the market and hence a considerable price increase is anticipated in coming month.

Regarding lime, a price increase of 98% was experienced in October, compared to previous month, due to decreased supply from Ampara and Moneragala. Meanwhile, the prices of green chilies have also started to show an increasing trend in October by 86% due to decreased supply from Puttalam.

In line with the wholesale prices, the retail prices of most of the vegetables have increased in October. The highest price increase was reported for capsicum as 33% followed by 29% for beans.

4. Fruits

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Demand for most of the fruits have decreased during the month compared to the previous month due to rainy weather condition. Hence, the wholesale prices of most of the fruits have decreased with the highest price decrease of 57% for slimeapple due to availability of low quality stocks at the market. The wholesale prices of mango (karthakolomban, vilad) have decreased by 51% and 27% respectively, due to availability of low quality stocks at the market. Further, the wholesale prices of all the sizes of pineapple had decreased in the range of 7%-16% due to low demand with rainy weather conditions. Price decrease for pineapple could be expected by the next month too at the unfavorable weather condition.

Meanwhile, the highest wholesale price increase of 20% was reported for orange due to low supplies from major producing areas. The price of banana (anamalu) has increased by 4% due to low supplies from Balangoda and Embilipitiya areas.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current wholesale prices of most of the fruits have increased with the highest price increase of 131% for mango (vilad).

According to the table 4.2, retail prices of most of the fruits have decreased with the highest price decrease of 36% for mango (karthakolomban). The retail prices of mango (vilad) have decreased by 17% due to availability of low quality stocks at the retail level. The retail price of woodapple has decreased by 18% due to increased supplies with commencement of the harvesting season. Price of woodapple has decreased due to increased supply from Beliatta, Wellawaya, Ambalantota and Buttala areas. The retail prices of papaw and slimeapple have decreased by 19% and 17% respectively.

Meanwhile, the retail price of orange has increased by 13% due to low supplies with the off season. Further, the retail prices of pineapple (medium size), passionfruit and avocado have increased in the range of 2%-6%.

Compared to the same period of last year, the current retail prices of most of the fruits have increased with the highest price increase of 47% for mango (karthakolomban).

According to the table 4.3, the producer price of papaw has decreased significantly by 49% compared to the previous month. Compared to the same period of last year, the producer prices of all the selected fruits except pineapple and banana (kolikuttu) have decreased with the highest price decrease of 39% for papaw.

Exports/Imports of Fruits

Papaw was the most exported type of fruit in October with the quantity of 393 mt. The total income of exporting pineapple, papaw, mango, orange and avocado was Rs.75.30mn in October.

Apple was the most imported type of fruit in October as usual. The total quantity of 2,485 mt of apple was imported. The value of imports was Rs.319.99mn. The total import expenditure of importing apple, grapes, orange and mandarin was Rs.561.90mn in October.

5. Fish, Dried Fish, Eggs and Meat

Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

As predicted in the previous month, wholesale prices of all the fresh fish varieties except mora, shrimp and thalapath had further decreased. Fishing season in the Eastern coastal belt had resulted in sufficient stocks reaching the market. However, increased prices were observed during the first week of the month due to the rainy weather condition prevailed in most of the areas in the country. Thereafter, a declining trend in prices was observed. The highest price decrease of 28% was noted for hurulla. Prices of salaya and thora had decreased by 16% and 12% respectively. Further, prices of paraw, balaya and kelawalla had decreased in the range of 2% - 9%. However, prices of shrimp, thalapath and mora had increased by 6%, 3% and 1% respectively. In the month of October, the average wholesale prices of selected fresh fish varieties ranged between Rs.117.73 – 870.16/kg. According to the data in previous years, fish prices could increase in the coming month due to the end of the fishing season in the Eastern coastal belt. Compared to the same period of 2014, wholesale prices of all the fresh fish varieties except balaya, mora and shrimp had increased in the range of 6%- 37% with the highest price increase noted for salaya.

In line with the decreased wholesale prices, retail prices of all the fresh fish varieties except shrimp had decreased. The highest price decreases were reported for thora (10%) and balaya (9%). Prices of kelawalla and salaya had decreased by 7% while, prices of hurulla and paraw had decreased by 5%. Further, a price decrease of 3% was noted for mora. Meanwhile, prices of shrimp and thalapath had also changed. However, the level of change was not significant. In the month of October, the average retail prices of selected fresh fish varieties ranged between Rs.158.06 – 1,162.24/kg. Compared to the same period of 2014, retail prices of most of the fresh fish varieties had increased in the range of 2%-16% with the highest price increase noted for hurulla.

Dried Fish

Prices and Supply/Demand Situation

Supplies of both local and imported stocks were at a satisfactory level. Hence, the prices of some dried fish varieties had decreased. Among them, local and imported sprats, local balaya, imported mora and local salaya had shown significant price decreases. Prices of imported thora and balaya have also decreased. However, the level of decrease was not significant. Among the price increased varieties, local and imported anguluwa had shown significant price increases. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of most of the dried fish varieties had increased and the highest price increase of 33% was reported for imported maduwa.

Stocks of local dried fish varieties were mainly supplied from Kalpitiya, Mannar, Kalmunai, Negombo, Valachchena, Jaffna and Trincomalee areas. Main imported countries were Pakistan, India, Thailand, Dubai, Oman, Vietnam and Indonesia.

According to market information, there was a high demand for sprats, Keeramin, balaya, kattawa and anguluwa varieties. Among imported stocks, some varieties which were imported from Maldives had a higher demand.

Reports of the Department of Sri Lanka Customs revealed that a quantity of 1,701 mt of dried sprats was imported in October. Imported quantity has decreased by 563 mt against the previous month. The main reason for the decrease was high supplies of local stocks. The value of the imports was Rs.624mn and the average CIF price was Rs.366.60/kg. Of the total imports, 97% was imported from Thailand and the balance was from Vietnam, United Arabs Emirates and India.

In line with the decreased wholesale prices, retail prices of most of the dried fish varieties have decreased. However, the level of decrease was less than 6% against the previous month. Meanwhile, the prices of anguluwa and maduwa have increased slightly. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of most of the dried fish varieties had increased.

Eggs

Compared to September, prices of both brown and white eggs had further decreased by 2% at the wholesale level. At the same time, egg prices remained unchanged throughout the month. The monthly average wholesale price of a brown egg was Rs.14.00 and it was Rs.13.00 per white egg. According to the price behaviour in previous years, egg prices could further decrease in the coming month with the increased supply. Compared to the same period of the last year, wholesale prices of both brown and white eggs had increased by 38% and 35% respectively.

In line with the decreased wholesale prices, prices of both brown and white eggs had also decreased by 2% at the retail level. The monthly average retail prices of a brown and a white egg were Rs.15.25 and Rs.14.29 respectively. Further, the price range of an egg for the month was Rs.13.50 – 16.00. Compared to the same period of the last year, retail prices of both brown and white eggs had increased by 27% and 28% respectively.

Prices of all the meat varieties except mutton have decreased. Price decreases were mainly due to the low demand. The highest price decrease of 6% was reported for curry chicken. Compared to the same period of last year, prices of all the meat varieties had increased in the range of 13% to 25% with highest price increase for curry chicken.

6. Wheat grain, Wheat flour and Sugar

Wheat grain, Wheat flour

The imported quantity of wheat grain has shown a significant decrease because the imports in previous month were high and recorded quantity. Total quantity of 105,781 mt valued at Rs.4,023mn was imported in October. Meanwhile, the world prices of wheat grain are in a gradual increasing trend since August 2015. The CIF price of wheat grain ranged between Rs.32.17-54.02/kg and the average was Rs.38.00/kg. Out of the total imports 53% was imported from Canada and the price of that was Rs.40.56/kg. Rest of the stocks were imported from Russia, U.S.A., Australia and India. The lowest quantity of only 50 mt was imported from India which fetched the highest CIF price of Rs.54.02/kg.

The wheat flour imports are always low in quality and it was limited to only 96 mt in October. The total value of the imports was Rs.6.64mn and the average CIF price was Rs.68.75/kg. Out of that quantity about 98% imported from India, while the rest from Singapore.

Retail price of wheat flour was in the range of Rs.75.00-90.00/kg. The average price was Rs.86.90/kg. Retail price has increased by cents 41/kg against the previous month, while it had decreased about 11% when compared to the same period of last year.

Sugar

Total quantity of 55,301 mt was imported and the value of the imports was Rs.2,862mn. A significant increase in the imported quantity was recorded and it was 17,741 mt against the previous month. Among the imports 83% from Brazil, 10% from Thailand, 6% from India and the rest was from Belize, Korea and Myanmar. The CIF price ranged between Rs.49.93-86.66/kg and the average price was Rs.51.75/kg. The highest quantity which imported from Brazil fetched the lowest CIF price of Rs.49.93/kg, while the highest CIF price of Rs.86.66/kg was reported for the stocks which imported from Myanmar.

With the increase of imports duty of sugar up to Rs.30.00/kg in October, retail price also has increased by Rs.6.00/kg against the previous month. Retail price remained in the range of Rs.82.00-100.00/kg and the average price was Rs.92.76/kg. Compared to the same period of last year retail price of sugar had decreased by 7%.

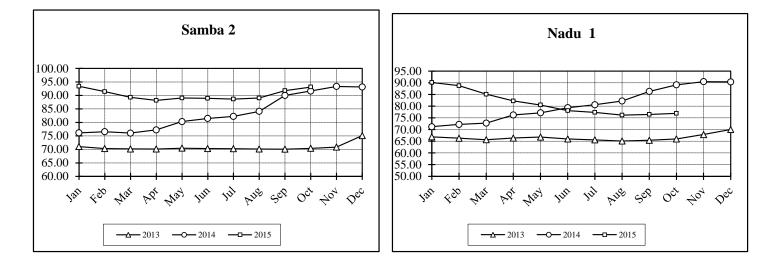

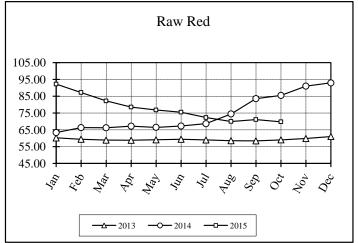
